

Report Summary

Social distancing and wearing a mask are critical practices that are essential to help prevent COVID-19 from spreading. The best way to practice social distancing is to avoid public places and to maintain a distance of at least six feet between you and others. In addition, practice frequent handwashing and do not touch your eyes, nose or mouth. If you need to get tested or are wanting to get the vaccine, please go to the Logan County Health Department's website for testing and/or vaccination sites and times.

Lincoln Police responded to 806 incidents for the month and 110 case reports were written for the month. Officers responded to 23 vehicle crashes. Patrol officers wrote 67 citations and 56 warnings for the month along with 1 City Ordinance Citation.

Of the 43 arrests for the month, officers arrested several for, driving with suspended/revoked drivers license (misdemeanor and felony), domestic battery, DUI's and warrants. Of the 43 arrest, there were 2 incidents were the officers had to use force to gain control of the offender. Detectives continued investigations on 20 cases including participating in CIEG task force operations.

The K9 unit is very beneficial to the Lincoln Police Department and the community. The K9 unit devoted a lot of time to training this month.

DARE was able to help a variety of students from different school this past month.

There were 23 crashes the Lincoln Police Department responded to for the month of April.




MONTHLY STATISTICS


Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR)

UCR Report for April 2021











DIVISION REPORTS

Criminal Investigations

The detectives of the Criminal Investigation Division of the Lincoln Police Department conducted further investigation on <u>20</u> active criminal investigations in the month of April. The types of investigations are listed but due to the sensitivity of those investigations, specific information is not available to for release.

- (11) Investigations involved sexual offenses.
- (2) Investigations involved crimes against persons.
- (4) Investigations were property related.
- (2) Investigations were narcotics related.
- Investigators executed 1 search warrant.
- Two officers of the Criminal Investigations Division continued to participate in a multijurisdictional drug task force, conducting joint investigations with other local, state, and federal agencies.

Lincoln K9

Officer Sullivan and K9 Ace devoted a lot of time to training this month. K9 Ace worked on his agility, evidence searching skills and tracking skills. He also trained on his detection exercises with multiple different types of environments.

School Resource for LCHS and District #27

Our School Resource Officers are always putting forth the positive attitudes that the kids are needing in these uncertain times. Always remember that the SRO's are there for your students if they need that ear to listen to them or just have questions they need answered.

The goals of well-founded SRO programs include providing safe learning environments in our community's schools, providing valuable resources to school staff members, fostering positive relationships with youth, developing strategies to resolve problems affecting youth and protecting all students, so that they can reach their fullest potentials. The three main roles of school resource officers are: educator (i.e. guest lecturer), informal counselor/mentor, and law enforcement officer.

Officer Butterfield reported that the incidents he responded to in April were fighting, parking issues, harassment/bullying and general misconduct that result in parental contacts. Officer Butterfield also attended criminal justice reform training this past month. He participated in CED Lockdown Drill. He sat in on the Lincoln Christian University table top and he attended a meeting at St. John's church for SRP.

Officer Fruge reported that the kids, at district #27, are getting excited about summer break The most common incidents that Officer Fruge responded to were social/emotional issues, general counseling issues and truancy issues.
