

2022 is the Year of Prayer



FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Friends,

As the council and I have thought about this next coming year, we agreed that the theme needs to be prayer! I strongly believe, as I'm sure you know by now, in the power of prayer. And so does my family. My Dad has had a vision that it's through prayer that our country will turn around, no matter what someone's faith community may be or if they even are not connected to one. He believes that prayer is the first step towards turning the world to the ways of God which of course are all good things: love, peace, justice, forgiveness, etc. And he may just be right about this.

So, in 2022, I would like to ask you each to commit to praying for our church every single day. It doesn't matter what words you say, or what specifics you are praying for, but I'd like you to pray every day. And I want to make it as easy and convenient for you as I can. So, you can simply say a prayer using our mission statement: "God, may our church, St. John United Church of Christ, grow mightily in being Your light within the community we serve." Of course, you can say more words or pray for someone or something specific. You can say it with your prayers for others in your life and/or your own soul. One suggestion is to say it at the same time each day so that it becomes a habit. Choose a time and place that works best for you. Perhaps it's best before you rise in the morning or sleep at night. Or you may like to say it as you start up your car or you eat a particular meal. Be intentional!

The one other part of prayer that is most often forgotten is listening. We can say lots of words to God, but we also need to make time for God to speak to us and to hear what God is saying. God may not come to you in a burning bush, but you never know. God is God. God often comes to me in dreams and in thoughts. It's usually a new thought that I don't think I would've thought up myself. For example, every sermon I write, I pray a

lot during the writing of it. And often times, I suddenly come up with an idea. I often smile and say, "Thank you!" Also, God speaks through other people or situations. Sometimes I'm contemplating an idea about a Scripture, and someone will say something perfect to illustrate that idea. Sometimes you can be reading the Bible or a devotional book and suddenly something just comes to you. How do we know if it's God? If it's a thought, idea, feeling, etc. that clarifies, teaches love or kindness or lifts your heart? Well, you know the Divine has sparked your soul!

Let's let 2022 be the year of prayer in St. John United Church of Christ. As Paul says, "Pray without ceasing", which is wonderful but even if it's just one sentence a day, I'm so excited to see what God will do with us as we grow closer and closer to our God in prayer. Maybe we will be the ones who start changing the world! Invite others to pray for our church, too. And! If you'd like a prayer group or a prayer partner, please let me know! You are all in my prayers!

ST. JOHN UNITED CHURCH OF CHRIST UNAPPROVED CHURCH COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES

Monday, December 13, 2021 | 7:00 p.m.

President Goetsch called the meeting to order at 7:05 p.m. on Monday, December 13, 2021.

CONSENT AGENDA APPROVAL

President Goetsch inquired if there were any items up for removal or discussion as it related to the Consent Agenda items. President Goetsch did make note that the transfers for this year are at \$120,000. \$105,000 from Special Funds and \$15,000 from the Farm Income. He indicated that the transfer amount was about the same as it was last year. It was moved and seconded to approve the agenda. All voting aye, the motion passed.

PASTORS REPORT

Pastor Laurie indicated today she held communion at St. Clara's. She stated she is also still delivering communion to the homebound as well as still working on worship planning. Pastor indicated she has been issuing personnel reviews and the only two still outstanding are Laura Lee and Tracy Welch. Pastor indicated that all job descriptions were reviewed and minor amendments were made to the Office Manager, Financial Manager and the Chime Choir Director. President Goetsch indicated he had sat in on a couple of the reviews and believe they went well. It was moved and seconded to accept all changes to the job descriptions. All voting aye, the motion passed.

Pastor then discussed the Mission Insight changes passed out which highlighted the demographics in regards to the top 15 ministry recommendations and social media preferences of area population.

Pastor also indicated she will be on vacation from December 26, 2021 through December 30, 2021 and on Sunday, January 2, 2022.

OLD BUSINESS

Security System – President Goetsch indicated Gary Atteberry had negotiated the technology bid down to approximately \$9,950. The bid included upgrades of 3 cameras replaced, and additional camera as well as a new DVR recording system. Service agreements for the monitoring of fire and smoke were still being worked out. It was moved and seconded to empower a committee made up of Gary Atteberry, Warren Goetsch, Kent Paulus and Pastor Laurie with the assistance of Darlene Begolka to approve negotiations with the vendor resulting in contracts for less than \$10,000 for the replacement/additional equipment and less than \$3,000 for the annual service agreements. All voting aye, the motion carried.

Nominating Committee – Edna Mara indicated that there is still no Youth Conference delegate. She presented that Dan Row and Leland Semple have agreed to join the Council. They are still working on a third person and will follow up with Troy Meinershagen on the status. Delegates for the Western Association are Bob Meinershagen and Donna Kessinger. The Illinois Conference delegate is Donna Kessinger and Edna Mara will replace Karen Birnbaum on the Scholarship Board.

President Goetsch reiterated the Annual Congregational Meeting date, due date for the Annual Reports and when the 2021 Treasurer's Books close for advisory purposes only.

Jack Leich indicated Tonita Reifsteck was seeking Council approval to update the bulletin board in Fellowship Hall. Council approved. Jack also indicated that without the Boy Scouts there would be no Christmas trees in the sanctuary. Jack indicated he would like to reward the Scouts for their hard work by treating them to a meal at Culvers. It was moved and seconded to thank the Boy Scouts for assisting with decorating the church that he would like the church to treat the Scouts to

a meal at Culvers. The date would be worked out with the Scouts. All voting aye, the motion carried.

NEW BUSINESS

Cue Offering – Pastor Laurie inquired if it was possible to move this offering to Seminary Sunday which is February 27, 2022. She believes the church would get a better offering by moving it to a later date. President Goetsch suggested to move the CUE Offering to Seminary Sunday and Council agreed.

Pastor Laurie recommended to close the office at noon on Fridays. It was moved and seconded to close the church office on Friday afternoons to the general public and church members. All voting aye, the motion carried. The action will be effective January 1, 2022.

President Goetsch indicated the church office will be closed on December 27th through the 30th as Pastor Laurie is on vacation and Darlene is taking some time off.

Pastor Laurie indicated that it is tradition to pass out oranges and apples at Christmas Eve service. Pastor Laurie has a box of rotary oranges and the Council approved the tradition to continue just the oranges. The cost of the oranges was \$44 dollars. Pastor Laurie will be reimbursed.

Pastor Laurie recommended Communion be changed to January 9th instead of January 2, 2022 due to her absence. Council approved.

Jack Leich reminded Council that when Pastor Laurie is absent, that whoever is replacing her on that Sunday needs to be introduced to the Congregation.

CORRESPONDENCE AND E-MAILS-President Goetsch indicated he did have one item for discussion that he left at home. He will review and present at the next meeting in January.

ADJOURNMENT AND BENEDICTION

With no further business to discuss a motion was made, seconded and passed to adjourn the meeting. Meeting concluded at 8:19 p.m.

ST. JOHN 160th ANNIVERSARY

Highlights Sons and Daughter of St. John in Ministry

St. John United Church of Christ in Lincoln in its lifetime has, among other contributions to the community, started a school for children, opened a hospital during an outbreak of Typhoid Fever, and enriched the spiritual life of the world with the ordination of four ministers and a commissioning a nurse into missionary work in Africa.

On June 29, 1913 Reinhold Niebuhr, son of the pastor Gustav Niebuhr, was ordained at St. John Evangelical and Reformed Church. He immediately became Interim pastor as his father had died suddenly on April 13th of that year. Reinhold Niebuhr, a senior at Eden Theological Seminary in St. Louis at that time, had been 'filling in' for his father when he became ill and suddenly died. As a child, while the family was living in the hospital because of construction on the parsonage on Fifth Street, Reinhold, it has been told, was sitting with his feet dangling off the windowsill of their living quarters! Years later his aunt, Sister Adele Hosto would be living in a section of the 'new Deaconess Hospital'. Reinhold, after his duties of Interim were completed (finished the confirmation classes studies and confirmed that class) he entered Yale University, pastored a church in Detroit Michigan before becoming chair of faculty at Union Theological Seminary in New York City where he raised his family.

On July 13, 1925 another son of then current church's pastor, Elmer H. Hoefer having completed his studies at Washington University and Eden Theological Seminary was ordained by his father, Rev. J. A. Hoefer (and 3 clergy uncles). His first pastorate was in Fulton, Missouri. After many years in St. Louis, Missouri he retired in Lincoln contributing to St. John's ministry for many years until he and Thekla moved to Colorado.

On June 9, 1940, Walter W. Lauer was ordained into the ministry. Walter was the first 'son of the laity' of St. John – graduating from Elmhurst College and Eden Theological Seminary. His first pastorate was assistant pastor at St. Paul's Evangelical and Reformed in Pekin. Walter has participated in several special commemorative services and dedications throughout his ministry.

On June 6, 1965, John W. H. Bock, another son of the congregation was ordained into the Christian ministry. Son of a Lay leader, Henry F. A. Bock, John studied at Elmhurst College and Eden Theological Seminary in St. Louis. Missouria. His first pastorate was in Westphalia, Indiana then Elmira Ohio where he is retired.

February 11, 1962 Elsie Bock Piotraschke, daughter



of Mr. and Mrs. Henry F. A. Bock (and brother to John W. H. Bock) completed her studies at Elmhurst College and Deaconess School of Nursing. She was commissioned a missionary nurse and was assigned to Ghana West Africa where she was a

nurse for 2½ years. Returning home, she served as a midwife in Chicago for a time and then Colorado where she met Gerald. She was married at St. John and lived and worked in nursing in Colorado but never forgot her experience and needs in Africa. Elsie died in 2016.

Another son of the congregation, Ted Michalsen was ordained on January 11, 2009. Ted also grew up at St. John UCC, studied art at Eastern Illinois

University and entered **United Theological** Seminary in Twin cities (Minneapolis/St. Paul and finished his seminary training at **Eden Theological** Seminary in St. Louis, Missouria. His 'natural' artistic talent has enhanced many facets of his ministry including his ordination program. His first pastorate was in Andover, Ohio and has been pastor at Bethany UCC in Freeport since December 2011.

MASKING: Is required of everyone, vaxxed and unvaxxed.


SINGING: Masks required.

61 Christmas decor items were delivered to Vonderleith


4 boxes of toys and a check for \$125.25 were given to Toys for Tots



WORD FROM OUR NATIONAL OFFICE...

A tornado outbreak on December 10-11 took the lives of at least 88 people across five state and caused damage and economic losses projected at \$18 billion. The outbreak is already considered the costliest tornado event in U.S. history, according to AccuWeather. A few days later, severe weather caused loss of life and did further damage from Arizona to the Midwest.

There were a total of 34 confirmed tornados across eight states in the weekend outbreak, seven of which were rated EF3 strength by the National Weather Service. One of the 34 confirmed tornados had an approximate 227-mile-long-path of destruction spanning four states, with 200 miles of destruction in Kentucky alone.
