

Lincoln Police Department Monthly Report

December 2021

Report Summary

The City of Lincoln would like to remind everyone that the use of masks is very important in stopping the spread of the COVID-19 virus and keeping you and your loved ones safe. Anyone entering any business or organizations should wear masks while indoors or within 6 feet of others.

Lincoln Police responded to 909 incidents for the month and 76 case reports were written for the month. Officers responded to 22 vehicle crashes. Patrol officers wrote 28 traffic citations and 27 warnings for the month along with 2 City Ordinance Cannabis Citation.

Of the 27 arrests for the month, officers arrested several for thefts, warrants and criminal damage. Detectives continued investigations on 23 cases including participating in CIEG task force operations.

The K9 unit was dispatched twice in the month of December.

DARE was able to help with a donation to LCHS Basketball Boosters. DARE was also able to help some children with clothing and Christmas gifts thru donations.

The goals of well-founded SRO programs include providing safe learning environments in our community's schools, providing valuable resources to school staff members, fostering positive relationships with youth, developing strategies to resolve problems affecting youth and protecting all students, so that they can reach their fullest potentials.




Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR)







Criminal Investigations

The detectives of the Criminal Investigation Division of the Lincoln Police Department conducted further investigation on <u>23</u> active criminal investigations in the month of December. The types of investigations are listed but due to the sensitivity of those investigations, specific information is not available for release.

- (12) Investigations involved sexual offenses.
- (4) Investigations involved crimes against persons.
- (5) Investigations were property related.
- (2) Investigations were narcotics related.
- Two officers of the Criminal Investigations Division continued to participate in a multijurisdictional drug task force, conducting joint investigations with other local, state, and federal agencies.

The Criminal Investigations Division saw an increase in active investigations in 2021. The average number of monthly cases increased from an average of 17.4 cases investigated per month in 2020 to 19.6 cases investigated per month in 2021. 2021 showed to have the highest number of average monthly cases since 2018, which averaged 19.8 cases per month. The most frequent types of cases in 2021 were sexual offenses and property related crimes.

DARE/Community Policing

DARE was able to contribute to the LCHS Basket Ball Boosters this past month. DARE was also able to help multiple children out with clothing during the month of December. DARE has been given private donations to put toward providing children with clothing necessities.

Lincoln K9

Officer Sullivan and K9 Ace were dispatched twice the month of December. The first search K9 Ace indicated to drugs were Methamphetamines were found. The second search was for a subject. K9 Ace located the subject and the subject was apprehended.

School Resource for LCHS and District #27

The goals of well-founded SRO programs include providing safe learning environments in our community's schools, providing valuable resources to school staff members, fostering positive relationships with youth, developing strategies to resolve problems affecting youth and protecting all students, so that they can reach their fullest potentials. The three main roles of school resource officers are: educator (i.e. guest lecturer), informal counselor/mentor, and law enforcement officer.

Officer Butterfield responded to incidents at LCHS about class misconduct and incidents that required parental contact, theft, mental health issues and vandalism.

Officer Fruge has responded to incidents at LJHS about social/emotional issues and general counseling issues that required parental contact and truancy.
