Illini Head Coach Bill Self

Bill Self is in his second season at the helm of the Illini program following three years at Tulsa where he earned National Coach of the Year honors from the John & Nellie Wooden Foundation and The Sporting News in 2000.

After leading Tulsa to a 32-5 record and into a Regional Final appearance in 2000, Self became the first coach to lead two different schools to a Final Eight appearance with the Illini in 2001. Prior to his stop at Tulsa, Self spent four years at Oral Roberts where he built a program from 6-21 his first season to 22-6 in his fourth year.

A 1985 graduate of Oklahoma State, Self has worked under Larry Brown at Kansas and Leonard Hamilton and Eddie Sutton at Oklahoma State.

In his first season at Illinois. Self led the Illini to 27 victories, the second-most in school history and became just the fourth Big Ten coach since 1950 to defeat every conference school in his first season. He also became just the sixth coach in Big Ten history to win a Big Ten title in his first season.

Self was a finalist for the Associated Press National Coach of the Year, finishing fourth in voting, and a was a nominee for the Naismith College Coach of the Year.

Last Time Out: Western Illinois

Illinois held Western Illinois scoreless for the first nine and a half minutes of the game in jumping out to a 13-0 lead, watched as WIU closed to within 10 points at half, then exploded for a 98-62 win over the Leathernecks. Illinois shot 65 percent from the field in the second half, making 22 of 34 shots in running up 59 points. Four Illini scored in double figures led by Frank Williams with 17 and followed by Luther Head with 14, Cory Bradford with 13 and Brian Cook and Roger Powell with 12 each. The Illini used 26 assists to help score 33 baskets during the game.

BUZZERBEATERS ...

Illinois will be playing its fourth in-state opponent Dec. 18 when the Illini host the Illinois State Redbirds ... The Illini have defeated Eastern Illinois (93-53),Southern Illinois (75-72) and Western Illinois (98-62) before taking on ISU and Loyola-Chicago on Dec. 29. Illinois will play a sixth in-state school Feb. 23 at Northwestern ... Illinois is 95-12 all-time against in-state schools in non-confernence play ... Illinois' last loss to a non-Big Ten in-state school came Nov. 29, 1990 to Illinois-Chicago, a streak of 23 straight wins ... Since 1974, Illinois is 40-3 against non-Big Ten in-state schools.

Williams Running the Show Illini point guard Frank Williams turned in two memorable performances last week. In Illinois' come-from-behind win over Arkansas, Williams finished with a teamhigh 25 points, team-high seven assists, eight rebounds, and team-high three steals. 18 of his points came at the free throw line, where he shot 18-of-24. The 18 made free throws for Williams is just one short of the Illinois school record, while his 24 free throw attempts set a new school record. Of his three steals, none was more important than when Williams stripped an Arkansas guard in the backcourt with four seconds remaining to preserve the Illini victory. Against Arizona, Williams led Illinois' late rally, cutting a 19-point deficit down to four in the final minute. Williams tied his career high with 30 points against the Wildcats, connecting on 9-of-18 field goals. He heated up in the second half of both contests, scoring 21 of his 25 vs. Arkansas and 22 of his 30 vs. Arizona in the second half. For the week, Williams averaged 27.5 points, 5.5 assists, five rebounds, and two steals per game.

Comeback Kids Illinois had a habit of making great comebacks last year, and this year's team is well on the way to earning the title of "Comeback Kids" once again. Only nine games into the season, the Illini have fought back from two double-digit deficits to post victories. The Illini fell behind by 13 points against Penn, 32-45 with :47 left in the first half, before rallying for a 78-71 win. Illinois trailed by as many as 12 points against Arkansas Dec. 8, 36-48

with 17:49 remaining in the game, before mounting another comeback and finishing with a 94-91 victory.

Getting to the Line ... And Making it Count Through 10 games, Illinois has made more free throws (235) than its opponent has attempted (221) and has outscored opponents from the line in nine of the 10 games. Illinois has outscored its opponent by a combined score of 235-137 at the line, an average of 9.8 points more per game. The Illini made 37 free throws against Arkansas last week, just one shy of the school record, in 49 attempts, which is three short of the all-time UI record. As a team, Illinois is shooting 75.3 percent from the line this season, which is on pace to break the school record for free throw percentage. The current record is 74.4 percent by the 1996-97 team.

Krupalija Named MVPin Vegas

Damir Krupalija was named the MVP of the Las Vegas Invitational Tournament after an outstanding week of play. Despite coming off the bench and averaging just 21 minutes per game during the Invite, Krupalija averaged 10.5 points and 8.0 rebounds in the four games to earn MVP honors. Krupalija was in double figures against Eastern Illinois and Georgia Tech, scoring 12 points in both games. He nearly recorded a double-double against Penn, finishing with 9 points and 11 rebounds, and was just shy of a double-double again in the championship game against Southern Illinois, tallying 9 points and 9 rebounds. His 11 rebounds against Penn are the most by an Illini player this season. For the tournament, Krupalija shot 67 percent from the field.

Tournament Tested

Illinois has already earned four victories this season over teams that participated in last year's NCAA Tournament in Gonzaga, Eastern Illinois, Georgia Tech and Arkansas. Maryland, who advanced to the Final Four last season, and Arizona, who was national runner-up last year, were the fifth and sixth NCAA Tournament teams, respectively, that the Illini have faced this year. Illinois faces its seventh NCAA tournament team in Missouri on Dec. 22.

- Getting to the Line: In six of 10 games this season, Illinois has made at least as many free throws as its opponent has attempted, and has outscored opponents from the line in nine of the 10 games. Illinois has outscored its opponent by a combined score of 235-137 at the line, an average of 9.8 points more per game. Illinois has made 235 free throws, while opponents have shot a total of 221 free throws so far this season.
- Home Court Streakin': Illinois enters the Illinois State game on Dec. 18 with a 22-game winning streak at the Assembly Hall, the longest home-winning streak by the Illini since winning 28 straight from Feb. 11, 1988 to Jan. 15, 1990. Last year, Illinois completed its first unbeaten home season since the 1988-89 season (17-0). The current 22-game winning streak ranks ninth nationally.

of just three schools to have both its men's basketball and football teams ranked among the Top 10 in the nation. The Illini football team is ranked No. 7 in both the Associated Press and ESPN/USA Today Coaches' polls this week, while the

basketball squad is currently ranked No. 10 in the AP poll and No. 7 in the coaches' poll. Florida (No. 5 football, No. 5/3 basketball) and Maryland (No. 6 football, No. 2/2 basketball) join Illinois among the elite in both sports.

- Dee-Fence ... Dee-Fence: Through 10 games, the Illini have held opponents to 41.3 percent field goal shooting, including 34 percent from three-point range. The Illini are helping force 17.2 turnovers per game, while turning it over 14.6 times per game. Illinois has averaged 6.8 steals, and have shown unselfish play with an average of 17.7 assists per game.
- Starting High: Preseason pollsters placed the Fighting Illini as high as they've ever been entering a season. The USA Today/ESPN Coaches Poll started Illinois at No. 2 in the preseason poll, and the Associated Press had the Illini at No. 3. The two previous high marks for preseason rankings came in 1962 and 1984 when the AP had Illinois No. 2 in the preseason. *The Sporting News* ranked Illinois No. 1 in the preseason while *Sports Illustrated* had the Illini No. 2.
- Williams Preseason Honors: Guard Frank Williams was named to the Associated Press Preseason All-America First-Team Nov. 6. Williams was joined on the team by Duke's Jason Williams, Missouri's Kareem Rush, Stanford's Casey Jacobsen and Kentucky's Tayshaun Prince. The last Illinois player to earn First-Team All-America honors from AP in the postseason was Andy Phillip in 1943.
- **Select Company:** Bill Self became the first coach in 22 years, just the sixth all-time in the Big Ten, and second Illini coach to

win a Big Ten championship in his first season as coach at a conference school. Minnesota's Bill Musselman is the only coach to win an outright title in his first season in 1972. Other league rookies earning hardware are Iowa's Sam Barry in 1923, Michigan's George Veekner in 1929, Illinois' Doug Mills in 1937 and Purdue's Lee Rose in 1979.

• More Select Company: When Illinois defeated Iowa on Feb. 24, 2001, Bill Self became just the fourth coach in the Big Ten since 1951 (when Michigan State joined the league) to defeat every other conference team in his first season. The other three coaches are Indiana's Bob Knight in 1972, Iowa's Tom Davis in 1987 and Penn State's

Did you Know ...

- ... Frank Williams is the first Illinois player to be named Big Ten Player of the Year since Bruce Douglas was the UPI Coaches Co-Player of the Year in 1984 and the first Chicago Tribune Silver Basketball Trophy winner from Illinois since 1967.
- ... Frank Williams and Brian Cook. They share a common bond, being named Mr. Basketball in the state of Illinois. Williams won the award in 1998 and Cook in 1999.
- ... Since 1980 Illinois has signed 11 McDonald's All-Americans and two are currently on the Illini roster. Frank Williams made the All-America team in 1998 and Cook in 1999. Illinois ranks 11th all-time in number of McDonald's All-Americans to attend the school.
- ... Illinois has the 18th best all-time winning percentage (.644) among Division I schools, one spot ahead of Arizona.
- ... Illinois has an all-time record of 1414-782. The 1414 wins rank 18th on the Division I list, one spot ahead of Louisville.
- ... Illini Head Coach Bill Self helped Oklahoma State to a Big Eight Conference Tournament Championship.
- ... Eight Illini players have been firstround draft selections, including Nick Anderson and Kendall Gill from the 1989 Final Four team.

- Illini Milestone: Illinois became the 18th Div. I program to reach 1,400 all-time victories with the Feb. 17, 2001 win at Indiana.
- 20th 20-win Season: Last season,

Illinois posted its 20th 20-win season in Illini basketball history. It also marked the second-earliest 20th win in school history (by calendar date). The earliest was Feb. 11, 1989 when the Illini defeated Northwestern. That team went on to win a school-record 31 games.

- Wins, Wins and More Wins: Illinois' 27 victories during the 2000-01 season are the second-most wins in a season in school history. The school record for victories in a season is 31 in 1989.
- **Defending Home Court:** After four home games this season, Illinois opponents are shooting just .367 (81-221) from the field, .314 (22-70) from three-point range and .563 (45-80) from the free throw line.

In Illinois' 12 homes games at the Assembly Hall during the 2000-01 season, opponents shot a combined 34.6 percent (240-693 FG) from the field and 29.4 percent (74-252 3FG) from three-point range.

High-Scoring: After nine games this season, Illinois is averaging 84.4 points per game and shooting 46.0 percent from the field.

Last year, Illinois averaged 77.9 points per game, the highest Illini scoring average since 1994 when Illinois averaged 84.0 points per game. In Big Ten games, the Illini ranked second in the league in scoring with an average of 75.3 points.

Very Offensive: In Big Ten play last season, the Illini led the league in threepoint field goal shooting (.390), ranked second in scoring margin (+11.7), second in scoring (75.3 ppg) and third in field-goal shooting (.465). Illinois also ranked second in the league in assists (14.88) and third in offensive rebounds (12.63) and three-point

For the 2001-02 season, Illinois is scheduled to play at least 11, with the possibility of 13 regular-season games on national television. The Illini are scheduled to appear at least seven times on ESPN, at least three times on CBS and once on FOX Sports Net.

Bradford Holds NCAA 3-Point Record

Illinois junior guard Cory Bradford holds the NCAA record for consecutive games with a three-pointer with a trey in 88 straight games. He broke the previous record of 73 games set by Wally Lancaster of Virginia Tech from 1986-89 with his first trey against Arizona on Dec. 16, 2000.

Bradford also has started every game of his Illini career and enters the Arkansas game with a school-record streak of 107 starts for the Illini.

Bradford has scored 1,424 career points, 10th on the Illini career scoring list after passing Kendall Gill and Jerry Hester with 23 points Saturday night.

Bradford's streak of consecutive starts set a school record against Northwestern on Feb. 3, 2001, passing Richard Keene's previous record streak of 85 consecutive games started in an Illini career.

Top 10 Streak Alive

Illinois has been ranked in the ESPN/USA Today Coaches' Top 10 for 25 consecutive polls, the longest stretch of Top 10 action since a string of 28 straight polls in the Top 10 in the 1989 and 1990 seasons.

Illini Basketball is a Hot Ticket

For the first time in Assembly Hall history, the Fighting Illini sold out in season tickets with 16,500 sold. Of the six games not on the student season package (over the semester break), three sold out and one other is within 50 of selling out. Every Big Ten game is sold out for 2002. The eight sellouts last season were the most at the Assembly Hall since 1989.

Brian Cook had 18 points and nine rebounds, and Robert Archibald added 16 points to lead No. 3 Illinois to a 76-58 victory over Gonzaga on Friday night.

Cory Bradford had 17 points, and Frank Williams had 13 for the Illini (1-0), who were outrebounded 21-12 in the first half, but took advantage of their size in the second half by going to Cook and Archibald down low against a much shorter Gonzaga team.

Dan Dickau had 19 points for Gonzaga (0-1), which ended up outrebounding Illinois 40-30 but committed 20 turnovers.

Cook scored 15 of his 18 points in the second half and made 7-of-7 free throws as Illinois built a 72-54 lead with 2:50 remaining.

Illinois led 36-29 at halftime, but jumped out to a 41-29 lead on a 3-pointer by Sean Harrington and two free throws from Cook.

Gonzaga never got closer than seven points the rest of the game.

Zach Gourde had 15 points and 12 rebounds, and Cory Violette added 12 rebounds for Gonzaga, which shot 42 percent but made only 4-of-16 3-pointers.

The victory improved Illinois' all-time record in season openers to 84-13, to 82-15 in home openers and 32-7 in home openers at the Assembly Hall. The victory also was Illinois' 19th straight win at home.

Williams scored 16 of his 20 points in the second half and had six rebounds. He was 5-of-8 from the field and made 7-of-9 free throws. Freshman Luther Head came off the bench for Illinois to score 14 points on 7-of-9 shooting, most of those layups and dunks.

It was the 80th consecutive non-conference home victory for Maryland, the longest such run in the nation. It was also the Terrapins' fourth straight win overall after a season-opening defeat against Arizona.

After the Terrapins (4-1) went up by 12 at halftime, Dixon scored seven points in a 10-2 run at the outset of the second half to make it 51-31.

Despite playing its fifth game in nine days, Illinois (5-1) fought back - even after leading rebounder Brian Cook fouled out with 5:11 left.

The comeback was aided by poor free throw shooting by Maryland, which finished 12-for-24 at the line. The Fighting Illini closed to 66-58 with 2:56 left, but Chris Wilcox scored in the lane, then made one of two free throws on Maryland's next possession for an 11-point cushion.

Wilcox scored 19 points and six rebounds off the bench for Maryland, which beat a Top 5 team for the first time since 1998.

Blandon Ferguson had 11 points for Illinois, which three days earlier won the Las Vegas Invitational and was off to its best start in six years. But on this night, the Illini looked rather ordinary.

The Illini shot 33 percent and committed seven turnovers in the decisive first half.

Illinois was the highest-ranked non-conference team the Terrapins faced at home since they upset No. 1 Notre Dame in 1979.

In a rematch of last season's Midwest Regional final, Jason Gardner scored 18 of his 23 points in the second half, including six consecutive free throws over the final 54 seconds, as Arizona beat Illinois 87-82 in Phoenix.

Frank Williams scored 16 of his 30 points over the last 4:19 as the Illini, who trailed by as many as 19 points early in the second half, narrowed the gap to four

Rick Anderson scored a career-high 18 points and grabbed seven rebounds in 21 minutes for the Wildcats. Freshman Isaiah Fox added 12 points, nine in the first half as Arizona built a 16-point lead.

Illinois went inside in a 20-6 run that cut the lead to 64-59 on Damir Krupalija's two free throws with 7:31 to play. Arizona freshman Will Bynum's three-point play boosted the lead to 67-59 with 7:19 remaining. Illinois cut it to five again, but Anderson grabbed teammate Luke Walton's missed free throw and was fouled. Anderson made both free throws to make it 70-62, then Dennis Latimore scored inside to put Arizona up 72-62 with 4:38 to play.

Williams' third 3-pointer in his late rush cut the lead to 84-80 with 36 seconds to go. Gardner lifted Arizona out of danger with his final two free throws that made it 86-80 with 32 seconds remaining, then Fox made one of two from the line to put the Wildcats ahead 87-80 with 16 seconds to go. Sean Harrington, fouled by Fox on a 3-point attempt, made two of three free throws with 7.8 seconds to play for the final margin.

The Illini made four of 20 3-pointers for the game. Cory Bradford was 0-for-8 from 3-point range and 3-for-15 overall.

Arkansas played its trademark in-your-face defense Saturday, swarming the court, pressuring the ball and making every possession a difficult one for No. 5 Illinois. In the process, the Razorbacks repeatedly sent Illinois to the free throw line, particularly in the second half. And that's where the Illini were able to pull out a victory, rallying to beat the Razorbacks 94-91 and deny Arkansas coach Nolan Richardson his 500th career victory.

Frank Williams scored 25 points, with 21 coming in the second half. He hit 18-of-24 from the line, and also had a last-second steal as the Illini came back from a 12 point deficit to earn the victory.

Brandon Dean led Arkansas with a career-high 29 points, but he was called for an offensive foul with 5.5 seconds to go - his driving shot banked into the basket but didn't count. Arkansas' Jannero Pargo scored 28, with seven 3-pointers.

Cory Bradford's jumper with 6:30 left gave the Illini their first lead at 71-70. Illinois pushed the lead to nine with two minutes left, but Dean hit a 3-pointer and then drove for a basket to make it 87-83. J.J. Sullinger's three-point play with 58 seconds to go got Arkansas to 90-88. After a steal, the Razorbacks moved the ball around the court several times before Pargo hit a 3-pointer, making it 91-90 Arkansas with 31 seconds remaining.

Damir Krupalija's dunk on a pass from Bradford with 11 seconds left gave the Illini a 92-91 lead. Dean then drove the middle, ran into Illinois center Robert Archibald and was called for the critical foul.
