About Kent State

- Kent State is located in Kent, Ohio, and enrolls 30,242 students. The Golden Flashes are members of the Mid-American Conference.
- Head coach Stan Heath is in his first season at Kent State. He owns a 4-4 record with the Golden Flashes in first head coaching position. Heath served as an assistant at Michigan State for five seasons, Bowling Green for two, Wayne State for three, Albion for two and Hillsdale for one.
- Kent State returns three starters from a team that defeated Indiana 77-73, in the first round of the NCAA Tournament last season. KSU lost in the second round to Cincinnati 66-43.
- The Golden Flashes have won two at home this season with victories over Mercyhurst (90-68) and Chattanooga (75-56). KSU is 0-2 on the road with losses at Youngstown State (75-70) and Xavier (62-56), while posting a 2-2 mark on neutral sites.
- Senior Trevor Huffman, one of three captains, leads the team with 16.3 points per game. He has attempted 39 percent of the team's 3-pointers, while converting 35 percent of the time (19-for-55).
- Junior Antonio Gates is second on the club in scoring (14.6 ppg) and leads with 9.3 rebounds per game. At only 6-foot-5, Gates has been effective on both sides of the glass with 36 offensive boards and 38 defensive rebounds.
- Senior Andrew Mitchell, another captain, is the only other player averaging double-digits (13.6 ppg.). Mitchell has struggled this season from behind the arc, shooting 10-of-39 on 3-pointers for 25.6 percent. He shot 40 percent on treys last season.
- In Kent State's four victories, the Golden Flashes have outrebounded their opponent by an average of 11.2 per game.
- Kent State has only committed 96 turnovers in eight games and are averaging 12.0 per game, which is tops in the Mid-American Conference.

The Series

Today's game is the fifth meeting between the two schools. The series is knotted at two games a piece. The two teams haven't met since December 22, 1990, when the Golden Flashes defeated the 'Birds at Redbird Arena, 69-53. In 1989, Kent State downed the Redbirds, 73-69, again in Redbird Arena. ISU won the first two meetings in 1976 at Kent State (73-69) and in Normal (79-71) in 1977.

... Cause Santa Claus is Coming to Redbird Arena

Despite his hectic schedule during the busiest time of year, Santa Claus will visit Redbird Arena tonight during halftime. Santa will be located behind section H during the intermission, so you better not shout and you better not cry. In addition to Kris Kringle, any Redbird fans that wear Christmas clothing to tonight's game can purchase a game ticket for only \$3. Recognizing that the holidays are a family affair the Redbirds are also sponsoring Family Night for today's game. Two adults and two youth (14 & under) will get four tickets along with four Pepsi's and a popcorn for \$20.

Although the Weather Outside is Frightful, the Bus Shuttle is so Delightful

The Illinois State athletics department has implemented a bus shuttle service this season for all Redbird home games that will shuttle fans between the Motorcycle Instruction Range located on Gregory Street, west of the Illinois State Golf Course, and the South entrance of Redbird Arena. At the completion of the game, the shuttle bus will pick up fans at the South entrance on College Avenue. In addition to the free shuttle service, there are also \$3 parking lots located at the soccer and baseball complex on Adelaide Street and by University High School.

Home Sweet Home

The last four times Illinois State has lost a game on the road preceding a home date, the Redbirds have been victorious at Redbird Arena. In fact, the 'Birds have won 18 of their last 20 games in Redbird Arena. In 14 seasons, the Redbirds are 133-45 in Redbird Arena for a .747 winning percentage.

I Knew I Knew Ya

This won't be the first time Illinois State and Kent State will be seeing each other this season. Both programs were two of the eight-team field for the 2001 University Hoops Classic in Moon Township, Pa., earlier this season. The two schools never met during the three-day event. Illinois State finished fourth with a 1-2 record and Kent State placed fifth with a 2-1 mark.

Common Foes

Both teams have combined to play 18 games this season and it is surprising that these nonconference opponents would already share three common opponents, but that is the case tonight. Both teams defeated UC-Irvine with Illinois State winning 58-52 and Kent State rolling 75-64. Each lost to Hofstra with the 'Birds falling 82-80 in overtime and Kent State losing 67-64. The difference has been Chattanooga. Illinois State lost the Mocs in Chattanooga 70-59, while the Golden Flashes downed the Mocs 75-56, in Kent, Ohio.

Breaking In Boo

Illinois State's **Baboucarr Bojang** is in his sixth year of organized basketball and is still developing as a player. That's bad news for Redbird opponents considering Bojang has already posted four double-doubles in ten games and three 20-point efforts. At Chattanooga, Bojang posted a career-high 26 points and grabbed eight boards with seven of them coming off the offensive glass. He has scored double-digits in seven straight games and in every game this season except one.

Jeppson Pledging for the 1,000-Point Club

Of all the organizations on the Illinois State campus, the 1,000-Point Club must rank as one of the most exclusive with only 34 members in the last 104 years. The Redbirds' **Shawn Jeppson** is closing in on a membership, however. After scoring five points at Illinois, Jeppson currently owns 865 points for his career and only needs 135 more to become the 35th player in Illinois State history to reach the 1,000-point plateau.

Picked to Win the League? Chances Are You're Playing Illinois State

ISU will play 11 nonconference games this season. Of the Redbirds' 11 non-Missouri Valley Conference foes, seven of the teams were selected in the preseason polls to win their respective leagues. The seven preseason favorites are Weber State (Big Sky), UC-Irvine (Big West), UT-San Antonio (Southland), Illinois (Big Ten), Georgia Southern (Southern) and Central Michigan and Kent State, which are both favored to win the two divisions of the Mid-American Conference.

Bryson Out For Season

Tarise Bryson, the nation's top returning scorer, the reigning Missouri Valley Conference Player of the Year and Redbirds leading scorer for the last three seasons, fell to the floor on a drive to the basket at the 17:46 mark of the second half in Illinois State's 74-70 opening night victory over Weber State. The fall ended the season for the Redbirds sixth all-time leading scorer, as Bryson dislocated his right wrist and suffered severe ligament damage to his shooting hand. Bryson underwent surgery the day after the game and will face a year of rehabilitation. His wrist was in a splint for two weeks, a hard cast four weeks and another splint for four weeks. It will take six months to heal.

For Him, It's Easy Being Greene

Sophomore point guard **Vince Greene**, who sat out last season meeting NCAA requirements, already has five double-digit scoring efforts this season. Greene averaged 4.0 point per game in the Redbirds first four games of the season, but has averaged 9.7 points over the last six. In addition to his scoring, Greene is also accurate. He is shooting 52.6 percent on treys (10-for-19) and 85.7 from the free throw line (24-of-28).

FT Four-Peat ???

The Redbirds have opened the season shooting 76.8% from the charity stripe and are on a good start to eclipse 70% for a fourth straight season. ISU shot 72.8% from the free throw line last season, 74% in 1999-2000 and 73.5% in 1998-99. The Redbirds have not had a stretch of that length since it bettered 70% for a four-season span from 1982 through 1985.

D-Fence, D-Fence

In the first half against Central Michigan, the Redbirds caged the Chippewa scorers and held CMU to only 14 first half points. The Chippewas first half total equaled the lowest amount of points ever scored in a half by an Illinois State opponent in Redbird Arena, with Chicago State matching the feat last season. Central Michigan finished the half with 6-for-23 shooting (26.1%) and 1-for-5 on 3-pointers. The Redbirds also held the reigning Mid-American Player of the Year, David Webber, scoreless for the first frame for only the second time of his career.

THE LAST TIME THEY MET

Kent State Keeps Redbirds Winless

NORMAL, Ill. – Like a bad horror movie, the Illinois State University basketball team just can't stop churning out sequels.

Last night at Redbird Arena, the marquee read: "Nightmare on the Hardwood, Part Seven."

Another frightful shooting performance was one of the numerous culprits as the Redbirds dropped their seventh straight game without a victory in a 69-53 nonconference loss to Kent State before an audience of 7,068.

The Redbirds struggled to a 14-point halftime deficit and matters only got worse. Kent State, which moved to 5-4, led by as many as 27 points in the second half before ISU mounted a small comeback.

For the first 10 minutes, the ISU offense consisted of two Richard Thomas 3-pointers and a Reggie Wilson free throw. Wilson scored the Redbirds' first basket from inside 20 feet at the 9:52 mark to bring his team within six at 16-10.

A scant two ISU points in the final 4:33 of the half enabled the Golden Flashes to take a 38-24 advantage at the break.

Double-Double Debut for Mr. Bojang-Ies

Baboucarr Bojang played his first game in a Redbird uniform against Weber State and it was worth an encore. Bojang tapped his way to posting his first double-double, as the SMS-West Plains Junior College transfer tossed in 14 points and grabbed 10 rebounds. It was the first time since November 23, 1990, that a Redbird had a double-double performance in an opening game. The late Reggie Wilson poured in 22 points and hauled in 13 rebounds in the season opener at Dayton. It was also Wilson's first game as a Redbird after transferring from Lincoln Community College.

Jeppson Hits Century Mark

With six minutes left in the game at Georgia Southern, Illinois State guard **Shawn Jeppson** became the ninth Redbird in school history to drain 100 treys in a career. Jeppson stands in ninth place overall and needs nine 3-pointers to surpass former Redbird Kyle Cartmill.

Alexander the Great?

According to the roster and the register's office, **Gregg Alexander** is a true freshman, but on the court he plays like a savvy veteran. In his first season with the Redbirds, Alexander has logged 318 minutes, tops on the team, and coughed up only six turnovers. Alexander is averaging .019 turnovers per minute, which is the lowest percentage in the Missouri Valley Conference. He has dished out 25 assists which ranks third on the team and is third on the club in scoring with 10.3 points per game. Alexander also leads the team in steals with 16.

Built Ford Tough

Shedrick Ford is second on the Redbirds in scoring with 11.2 points per game and has scored double-figures for Illinois State in five games. Ford has been the leading scorer in two games and had a season-high 21 points against Hofstra. In the season opener against Weber State, Ford put the team on his back after the injury to **Tarise Bryson** and finished with 18 points and eight boards.

Alexander Goes Where Few Freshmen Have Gone Before

Since 1990, three true freshman have started their first collegiate games at Illinois State. One of them is current Redbird **Gregg Alexander**. Alexander drew the starting nod in the opener against Weber State and responded with eight points, one rebound and two assists in 20 minutes of play. Alexander joins P.J. Smith (1999) and Dan Muller (1994).

Been There, Done That

At the Missouri Valley Conference media day, Illinois State was tabbed as the preseason favorite to win the league title by the conference media and sports information directors. The Redbirds received 26 of the possible 30 first-place votes. The last time the 'Birds were chosen preseason favorites was in 1997-98. Illinois State went on to win the conference. In 1996-97, the Redbirds were also favored to win and won the league.

No Thanks, I'm Just Watching

Trey Guidry, a 6-2 guard, has transferred to Illinois State from North Carolina State, but cannot play for the Redbirds until the 2002-03 season. NCAA rules require that he sit out one season. Guidry was a spot starter for the Wolfpack last season as a freshman and recorded a scoring best of 15 points against Wake Forest.

It Never Gets Boring

Last season's trip to the NIT marked Illinois State's 14th post-season appearance in 31 seasons on the Division I level. The Redbirds have finished over .500 in all but three of their campaigns as a D-I school and own 13 20-win campaigns over the last 26 years.

A Trade-In???

It's not quite a trade, but next season when the Redbirds lose the services of **Shedrick Ford** to graduation they will add **Dana Ford**. Dana Ford, a 6-foot-4, 185 guard from Egyptian High School in Tamms, Ill., signed a national letter of intent during the early signing period with Illinois State. Last year, Dana Ford averaged 22.5 points and is the school's all-time leading scorer with 1,620 points.

Illini Downs Illinois State, 87-73

CHAMPAIGN, Ill. (AP) – It was a case of too much paint for Illinois State's basketball team Tuesday night at the Assembly Hall. No. 7-ranked Illinois scored 36 of its 50 second-half points in the paint to cover up ISU, 87-73, before a sellout crowd of 16,500 people.

The Illini (9-2) led by five at halftime but went on a 17-6 run in which Frank Williams scored eight straight points and 11 in total to help Illinois build a 20-point lead. He finished with 29 points - including 4-of-8 from 3-point range - one off his career high.

Leading 37-32 at halftime, the Illini extended their lead over Illinois State (4-5) to 50-38 in the opening minutes of the second half with Williams on the bench because of a stomach ailment. Reserve Damir Krupalija scored nine of Illinois' 13 points in the surge and finished with 14 points on 6-for-7 shooting.

Illinois made 13 of its first 17 field goal attempts after halftime and shot 60 percent in the half, with most of those points coming on shots near the basket. The Illini shot 53 percent for the game.

Baboucarr Bojang had 15 points for the Redbirds.

The schools, located approximately 50 miles apart, played for just the seventh time, the first since 1982.

The Illini won the last meeting 67-60, and has lost to the Redbirds once, in 1906.
