FIGHTING ILLINI HOOP NOTES

Illini Head Coach Bill Self

Bill Self is in his second season at the helm of the Illini program following three years at Tulsa where he earned National Coach of the Year honors from the John & Nellie Wooden Foundation and *The Sporting News* in 2000.

After leading Tulsa to a 32-5 record and into a Regional Final appearance in 2000, Self became the first coach to lead two different schools to a Final Eight appearance with the Illini in 2001. Prior to his stop at Tulsa, Self spent four years at Oral Roberts where he built a program from 6-21 his first season to 22-6 in his fourth year.

A 1985 graduate of Oklahoma State, Self has worked under Larry Brown at Kansas and Leonard Hamilton and Eddie Sutton at Oklahoma State.

In his first season at Illinois, Self led the Illini to 27 victories, the second-most in school history and became just the fourth Big Ten coach since 1950 to defeat every conference school in his first season. He also became just the sixth coach in Big Ten history to win a Big Ten title in his first season.

Self was a finalist for the Associated Press National Coach of the Year, finishing fourth in voting, and was a nominee for the Naismith College Coach of the Year in 2001.

For Openers...

Slim Big Ten title hopes are still alive for Illinois entering the final week of the regular season ... The Fighting Illini trail league leaders Ohio State and Indiana by one full game with two games remaining ... The Illini need to win its two games this week and have Michigan State or Michigan beat Ohio State to have its best chance ... During its six-game winning streak, Illinois' opponents have combined to shoot just 38 percent from the field (118-of-311) and 28 percent from 3-point range (34-of-121) ... With its victory over Penn State Feb. 20, Illinois has now reached 20 wins for the 21st time in school history, the third straight year, and fifth time in the last six seasons ... Illinois is trying to win at least 10 games in conference play for the third straight season, and fifth of the last six years ... Frank Williams celebrates

his 22nd birthday on Feb. 25 ... Robert Archibald had the second-best shooting day in Illinois basketball history Feb. 20 against Penn State when he made 11-of-12 attempts on his way to a career-high 25 points. Only Derek Harper's perfect 11-for-11 shooting in 1983 tops Archibald's recent performance in the Illinois record books ... A pair of victories at Michigan and at Michigan State gives Illinois its first road sweep in the state of Michigan since 1989 ... Brian Cook became the 35th player in school history to score 1,000 or more career points during his 23-point, 15-rebound performance Feb. 16 at Seton Hall ... Illinois is the only team in the Big Ten to have three current players eclipse 1,000 career points (Bradford, Williams and Cook) ... Brian Cook has made 28 of his last 29 free throws over the span of the last 11 games, while Frank Williams has made 50 of his last 54 free throws over the span of the last 12 games ... In Big Ten play, Cook and Williams rank second and third, respectively, in free throw percentage with Cook at 91.7 percent (33-of-36) and Williams at 90.0 percent (54-of-60) ... Illinois is shooting 74.5 percent from the free throw line this season, which is on pace to break the school record of 74.4 percent set during 1996-97 ... Illinois shot a season-high 93.3 percent (14-of-15) from the free throw line and committed just eight turnovers, tying a season-low, in the victory at Michigan Feb. 7 for the Illini's first road win of the season ... Cory Bradford has started every game of his collegiate career (127 games) and set the Illinois school record with his 121st start against Michigan State on Feb. 3, surpassing the previous record set by Efreem Winters ... Illinois leads the Big Ten in scoring (77.0 ppg), but is third in scoring in league play at 70.9 points per game ... Frank Williams ranks fourth in the Big Ten in scoring with a 16.0 average, leads in steals with an average of 2.14 and is sixth in assists with 4.0 per game ... Williams is 15th on the UI career scoring list with 1,322 points, and needs 38 points to catch Dave Downey for 14th place ... Cory Bradford moved into fifth place on the UI career scoring list Jan. 15 against Iowa and with 1,632 career points, he needs 21 points to reach Mark Smith for fourth place ... Illinois' shooting percentage of .680 (34-50) against Michigan on Jan. 12 was the best since setting the school record of .691 (38-55) against Wisconsin-Green Bay on Dec. 4, 1985 ... Illinois also shot 68 percent (17-25) in the first half against Wisconsin on Jan. 23 ... The Illinois bench is averaging 22.6 (634 total) points per game after 28 games, while opponent reserves are averaging 19.3 (541 total) points per game.

rebounds per game while shooting an astounding 82.4 percent from the field, hitting 14 of 17 shot attempts. The senior forward recorded a pair of career-high performances on the week, beginning with a 25-point effort to equal a career-best vs. Penn State. Archibald added 10 rebounds against the Nittany Lions for his first double-double of the year and third of his career. He hit 11-of-12 shots against PSU for a percentage of 91.7 percent, the second-best shooting performance in UI school history. Archibald followed that performance by setting a career-high with 13 rebounds against Northwestern while adding seven points, three blocks and three assists. This is the first Conference weekly honor for Archibald.

Did you Know ...

... Frank Williams is the first Illinois player to be named Big Ten Player of the Year since Bruce Douglas was the UPI Coaches Co-Player of the Year in 1984 and the first Chicago Tribune Silver Basketball Trophy winner from Illinois since 1967.

... Frank Williams and Brian Cook. They share a common bond, being named Mr. Basketball in the state of Illinois. Williams won the award in 1998 and Cook in 1999.

... Since 1980 Illinois has signed 11 McDonald's All-Americans and two are currently on the Illini roster. Frank Williams made the All-America team in 1998 and Cook in 1999. Illinois ranks 11th all-time in number of McDonald's All-Americans to attend the school.

... Illinois has the 18th best all-time winning percentage (.644) among Division I schools, one spot ahead of Arizona.

... Illinois has an all-time record of 1427-787. The 1427 wins rank 18th on the Division I list, one spot ahead of Louisville.

... Illini Head Coach Bill Self helped Oklahoma State to a Big Eight Conference Tournament Championship.

... Eight Illini players have been first-round draft selections, including Nick Anderson and Kendall Gill from the 1989 Final Four team.

... Illinois ranks third in the Big Ten behind Indiana and Michigan in total NCAA appearances.

... Illinois is second in Big Ten wins behind Purdue and third in winning percentage in Big Ten games behind Indiana and Purdue.

Williams Earns Big Ten Honor

Junior guard Frank Williams earned Co-Big Ten Player-of-the-Week honors on Feb. 18 for the second time this season following Illini wins over Michigan State and Seton Hall. Williams shared the award with Wisconsin guard Kirk Penney.

Williams was named the Big Ten Co-Player of the Week after averaging 20.5 points, 5.5 rebounds, 4.0 assists and 3.0 steals in a pair of road wins, as the Illini stretched their winning streak to four straight games. The 2001 Conference Player of the Year opened the week with 22 points and eight boards in a crucial road triumph at Michigan State, as Illinois improved to 2-4 on the road in League play. Williams followed that performance with 19 points and five assists on the road at Seton Hall, including three treys to spark an Illini rally after the team fell behind 13-2 to start the game. Williams earned his second weekly Conference honor this season and the fourth of his career.

Illinois trailed by as many as 12 points against Arkansas Dec. 8, 36-48 with 17:49 remaining in the game, before mounting another comeback and finishing with a 94-91 win. On Feb. 7 at Michigan, Illinois trailed by 13 points, 14-27, with 6:10 left in the first half before fighting back for a 68-60 victory. Just two days later, Illinois found itself down 18 points to Purdue, 17-35 with 6:46 left in the first half, before rallying for a 69-67 victory. On Feb. 16 at Seton Hall, the Pirates jumped out to an 11-point lead at 13-2 with 16:36 remaining in the first half before the Illini posted a 75-65 win.

Krupalija Out Until At Least Big Ten Tourney

Illinois senior forward Damir Krupalija re-injured his left foot against Michigan State on Feb. 3 and had surgery Feb. 6 to place a small plate on the area affected by the stress fracture. It is hoped that Krupalija will return to the court for the Big Ten Tournament. Krupalija has missed 12 games this season because of his injured foot.

Illini Roster Yet To Reach Full Strength

After having key players missing practice time and games for a number of different injuries this season, Illinois' roster was nearly back to full strength before Damir Krupalija re-injured his foot Feb. 3.

Lucas Johnson returned to practice on Jan. 11 after suffering a torn ACL in his right knee that was surgically repaired in October. Johnson played in his first game Jan. 23 against Wisconsin, scoring five points and grabbing three rebounds in 12 minutes. Johnson made his first start of the season Feb. 3 against Michigan State. He played a season-high 27 minutes against Michigan on Feb. 7, scoring 10 points and tying his career high with eight rebounds.

Krupalija missed seven games and had not played since Dec. 22 before also returning to the court against Wisconsin. Krupalija played 11 minutes against the Badgers. He re-injured his left foot Feb. 3 against Michigan and is out for at least four weeks.

A Look at Illinois' RPI and Sagarin Ratings

Illinois currently (as of Feb. 24) ranks No. 16 in the nation in the ratings percentage index (RPI) with an RPI of .6139. The only Big Ten teams other than the Illini in the RPI's Top 40 are Indiana (17th), Ohio State (20th) and Michigan State (38th). Illinois' strength of schedule is ranked 26th in the country.

The Illini are ranked No. 11 in the nation in Jeff Sagarin's latest rankings (thru Feb. 24) with a rating of 87.83. Illinois' strength of schedule is ranked 21st by Sagarin.

High-Scoring Illini

Through 28 games this season, Illinois leads the Big Ten with a scoring average of 77.0 points per game and is shooting 46.1 percent from the field, which ranks fourth in the conference. The Illini have shown unselfish play with a Big Ten-leading average of 16.5 assists per game.

During Illinois' current six-game winning streak, the Illini are averaging 69.0 points while allowing 58.3.

Tournament Tested

Illinois has earned nine victories this season over teams that participated in last year's NCAA Tournament in Gonzaga, Eastern Illinois, Georgia Tech, Arkansas, Missouri, Iowa, Wisconsin, Michigan State and Penn State. The Illini have lost to Arizona, who was the national runner-up last year, Maryland and Michigan State, Final Four participants from a year ago, and Wisconsin, Indiana and Ohio State. Illinois has played 15 games against last season's NCAA Tournament field. Illinois will play its 16th game against an NCAA Tournament team, Indiana, on Feb. 26.

Williams Among 30 Midseason Candidates for Wooden Award

Frank Williams is one of 30 candidates placed on the midseason list (released Dec. 27) for the John R. Wooden Award Player of the Year and All-America Team. Joining Williams on the midseason list from the Big Ten are Luke Recker and Reggie Evans of Iowa and Jared Jeffries of Indiana.

Getting to the Line ... And Making it Count

Illinois has outscored opponents from the line in 21 of 28 games this season. The Fighting Illini have outscored its opponent by a combined score of 526-404 at the line, an average of 4.4 points more per game. The Illini made 37 free throws against Arkansas on Dec. 8, just one shy of the school record, in 49 attempts, which is three short of the all-time UI record. Against Minnesota on Jan. 2, the Illini outscored the Gophers 20-to-6 from the free throw line. The Illini shot a season-high 93.3 percent against Michigan on Feb. 7, connecting on 14-of-15 from the line. Illinois has made more free throws than any team in the Big Ten and is shooting 74.5 percent from the line this season, which ranks second in the Big Ten. The Illini are also on pace to break the school record for free throw percentage in a season. The current Illinois record is 74.4 percent set during the 1996-97 season.

Top 10 Streak Snapped

Illinois moved to No. 12 in the Jan. 28 ESPN/USA Today Coaches' poll, snapping a school-record streak of 30 consecutive appearances in the Top 10, the first 30 polls after Bill Self was named head coach Jan. 21, 2002. The previous longest stretch of Top 10 action was a string of 28 straight polls in the AP Top 10 from the preseason 1989 poll until Jan. 23, 1990.

Illinois has been ranked in the Associated Press and ESPN/USA Today Coaches Polls for 37 consecutive polls.

Illini Gridder Young Has Short Stint With Hoops Squad

Illinois junior wide receiver Walter Young, who began practicing with the basketball team on

Jan. 17 and saw his first action against Wisconsin on Jan. 23, has returned back across Kirby Avenue to prepare for spring football. A knee injury suffered in the Nokia Sugar Bowl kept Young on the sidelines during practice last week and the decision was made to allow his knee to heal before spring practice opens in March. He saw action in two games, scoring two points and grabbing one rebound. Young was second on the Big Ten Champion Illini football team with 50 receptions for 890 yards and eight touchdowns. The 6-foot-5-inch forward was the first Illinois student-athlete since 1973 to play both football and basketball in the same season. Jim Rucks and Garvin Roberson were the last two Illini to double up in the same academic year. Rucks played for the Illini basketball team in 1971, 1972 and 1973, while lettering as a tight end in football in 1970, 1971 and 1972. Roberson played basketball in 1972 and 1973, while lettering as a split end on the football team from 1971-73. Jeff Finke played basketball as a freshman at Illinois in 1987 before switching to football from 1987-90 because of a back injury.

Top 10 Matchups

When No. 9 Illinois defeated No. 8 Missouri on Dec. 22, it marked Illinois' third Top 10 showdown of the season. On Nov. 27, No. 2 Illinois fell at No. 5 Maryland 63-76 and on Dec. 4, the No. 5 Illini lost to No. 7 Arizona in Phoenix, 82-87. Illinois is 1-2 in Top 10 matchups this year. Last season the Illini were involved in seven games between two Top 10 programs, posting a 4-3 record.

- **Dee-Fence ... Dee-Fence:** Through 28 games, the Illini have held opponents to 41.2 percent field goal shooting, including 33.0 percent from three-point range. The Illini are forcing 15.6 turnovers per game and have averaged 7.3 steals.
- **Defending Home Court:** After 13 home games this season, Illinois opponents are shooting just .386 (283-734) from the field, .313 (77-246) from three-point range and .622 (158-254) from the free throw line.

In Illinois' 12 home games at the Assembly Hall during the 2000-01 season,

opponents shot a combined 34.6 percent (240-693 FG) from the field and 29.4 percent (74-252 3FG) from three-point range.

• **Starting High:** Preseason pollsters placed the Fighting Illini as high as they've ever been entering a season. The USA Today/ESPN Coaches Poll started Illinois at No. 2 in the pre-season poll, and the Associated Press had the Illini at No. 3. The two previous high marks for preseason rankings came in 1962 and 1984 when the AP had Illinois No. 2 in the pre-season. *The Sporting News* ranked Illinois No. 1 in the pre-season while *Sports Illustrated* had the Illini No. 2.

• **Williams Preseason Honors:** Guard Frank Williams was named to the Associated Press Preseason All-America First-Team Nov. 6. Williams was joined on the team by Duke's Jason Williams, Missouri's Kareem Rush, Stanford's Casey Jacobsen and Kentucky's Tayshaun Prince. The last Illinois player to earn First-Team All-America honors from AP in the postseason was Andy Phillip in 1943.

• **Select Company:** Bill Self became the first coach in 22 years, just the sixth all-time in the Big Ten, and second Illini coach to win a Big Ten championship in his first season as coach at a conference school. Minnesota's Bill Musselman is the only coach to win an outright title in his first season in 1972. Other league rookies earning hardware are Iowa's Sam Barry in 1923, Michigan's George Veekner in 1929, Illinois' Doug Mills in 1937 and Purdue's Lee Rose in 1979.

• **More Select Company:** When Illinois defeated Iowa on Feb. 24, 2001, Bill Self became just the fourth coach in the Big Ten since 1951 (when Michigan State joined the league) to defeat every other conference team in his first season. The other three coaches are Indiana's Bob Knight in 1972, Iowa's Tom Davis in 1987 and Penn State's Jerry Dunn in 1996.

• **Self Defense:** For the 2000-01 season, opponents shot just 38.6 percent from the field. That was the lowest opponent shooting percentage since the 1955-56 season when Illini opponents shot 35.2 percent from the field. Illinois finished third in the nation in field-goal percentage defense, behind only Kansas and Holy Cross.

In league play, the Illini were second in the Big Ten in field-goal percentage defense (.387) while ranking second in blocked shots (5.19), second in steals (7.44) and fourth in scoring defense (63.6).

• **Board Work:** This season, the Illini are averaging 36.9 rebounds per game, an average of 5.0 more boards than their opponent. Illinois' average of 40.0 rebounds per game in 2001 was the team's highest average since 1979

when the Illini averaged 41.3 rebounds per game. Illinois' rebounding margin (6.7) ranked 13th in the nation last year.

• **Williams Big Ten Preseason P-0-Y**
Junior Frank Williams was named Big Ten Preseason Player of the Year by both the media and coaches for 2001-02, as well as preseason First-Team All-Big Ten. Last year, Williams was the first Illini player to earn conference player of the year honors since Bruce Douglas was named co-Big Ten Player of the Year (with Purdue's Jim Rowinski) in 1984. Illinois' last league MVP before Williams in 2001 was Jim Dawson in 1967.

• National Exposure

For the 2001-02 season, Illinois is scheduled to play 13 regular-season games on national television. The Illini are scheduled to appear eight times on ESPN, four times on CBS and once on FOX Sports Net.

• Bradford Holds NCAA 3-Point Record

Illinois junior guard Cory Bradford holds the NCAA record for consecutive games with a three-pointer with a trey in 88 straight games. He broke the previous record of 73 games set by Wally Lancaster of Virginia Tech from 1986-89 with his first trey against Arizona on Dec. 16, 2000.

Bradford also has started every game of his Illini career and enters the Seton Hall game with a school-record streak of 124 starts for the Illini.

Bradford's streak of consecutive starts set a school record against Northwestern on Feb. 3, 2001.

• Illini Basketball is a Hot Ticket

For the first time in Assembly Hall history, the Fighting Illini sold out in season tickets with 16,500 sold. Of the six games not on the student season package (over the semester break), four sold out. Every Big Ten game is sold out for 2002. The eight sellouts last season were the most at the Assembly Hall since 1989. Illinois is assured of a school-record 12 sellouts this season.

• Four Sign With Illini in November

Four future Fighting Illini players signed national letters of intent to attend Illinois during the fall signing period in November. **Dee Brown**, a 6-foot guard from Proviso East High School in Maywood, Ill., **Deron Williams**, a 6-3 guard from The Colony, Texas, **Kyle Wilson**, a 6-8 forward from Plano, Texas and **James Augustine**, a 6-10 forward from Lincoln-Way Central High School in New Lenox, Ill., all signed with the Illini. *Bob Gibbons' All-Star Report* ranks the Illini class No. 4 in the nation. The Illini have one scholarship remaining to issue in the spring.

2001-02 Fighting Illini Season in Review

Game 1 #3 Illinois 76 Gonzaga 58 Nov. 16, 2001

Assembly Hall, Champaign, Ill.

Brian Cook had 18 points and nine rebounds, and Robert Archibald added 16 points to lead No. 3 Illinois to a 76-58 victory over Gonzaga on Friday night.

Cory Bradford had 17 points, and Frank Williams had 13 for the Illini (1-0), who were outrebounded 21-12 in the first half, but took advantage of their size in the second half by going to Cook and Archibald down low against a much shorter Gonzaga team.

Dan Dickau had 19 points for Gonzaga (0-1), which ended up outrebounding Illinois 40-30 but committed 20 turnovers.

Cook scored 15 of his 18 points in the second half and made 7-of-7 free throws as Illinois built a 72-54 lead with 2:50 remaining.

Illinois led 36-29 at halftime, but jumped out to a 41-29 lead on a 3-pointer by Sean Harrington and two free throws from Cook.

Gonzaga never got closer than seven points the rest of the game.

Zach Gourde had 15 points and 12 rebounds, and Cory Violette added 12 rebounds for Gonzaga, which shot 42 percent but made only 4-of-16 3-pointers.

The victory improved Illinois' all-time record in season openers to 84-13, to 82-15 in home openers and 32-7 in home openers at the Assembly Hall. The victory also was Illinois' 19th straight win at home.

Williams, who scored on a variety of shots off drives and added three steals, helped Illinois beat Missouri for the second straight season in the neutral-court series.

Brian Cook added 12 points and eight rebounds for the Illini, who beat a Top 10 team for the first time in three tries this season after losing to Arizona and Maryland. Illinois, which shot 50 percent overall, led 33-31 at the break.

Williams scored six of his points in a two-minute stretch of the second half, pulling up in the lane, shooting over 6-foot-9 Arthur Johnson and squirming for room on the baseline to give Illinois a 55-48 lead with 5:42 left. Williams, averaging 24 points the past five games on nearly 50 percent shooting, helped finish off Missouri with a driving, twisting shot with 1:49 to play that put Illinois up 62-53.

Rodney Smith had 17 points to lead six Purdue players in double figures and the Boilermakers avoided their first 0-3 start in the Big Ten in 38 years with an 84-75 victory over No. 9 Illinois. Purdue coach Gene Keady credited the defense that held Illinois to 32 percent shooting in the second half as the difference.

Williams finished with 23 points, while Bradford had 13 and Robert Archibald 12. Illinois finished the game without Archibald and Sean Harrington, who had 11 points, as they both fouled out.

Austin Parkinson scored 13 points, Deane had 12, Maynard Lewis 11, and Kilgore and Joe Marshall each had 10 for the Boilermakers, who had lost four of their last five games.

Asked about one of his jaw-dropping passes, Frank Williams responded with a question of his own.

Cory Bradford had 16 points on 4-of-10 shooting from 3-point range for Illinois, which shot 48 percent for the game and outrebounded the Hawkeyes 38-31.

Illinois turned in one of its best defensive efforts of the season in a 56-41 victory over Northwestern on Saturday as the Wildcats set season-lows for points, field goals and shooting percentage.
