Free Throw Fest

Taren O'Brien's 11 free throws made (in 12 attempts) vs. Wichita State (1/24) tied the Redbird Arena record for free throws made by a Redbird player (Caryn Brune, 12/11/92) and, as a team, Illinois State's 37 free throw attempts matched the Redbird Arena record by an Illinois State team (Evansville, 1/30/97).

Pressure Produces Points

With 10 minutes left at SIU, the Redbirds trailed 50-39. But the 'Birds a defense which forced nine turnovers in 13 SIU possessions produced a 20-3 run over the next seven minutes. The Redbirds generally strangled SIU's offense, which produced only two field goals in the final 10 minutes. Twenty of the Redbirds' 37 second-half points came off turnovers ...

Four days later, Wichita State was held to 1 of 11 field goals from the 7-minute to the 1-minute mark in the second half as the Redbirds ended a four-game losing streak to the Shockers.

Stronger Since Bradley

Since the Redbirds' 71-36 loss at Bradley, the Redbirds are 3-2 on the strength of holding opponents to 37.4 percent from the field, 24.2 percent from three-point range. During those five games, the 'Birds have four players averaging double-figure points (O'Brien 12.8, Larson 11.2, White 11.0, Blade 10.5).

Coming Attractions

Point guard Desiree Gutierrez has joined high-scoring guard Sara Stevenson have signed national letters of intent for basketball at Illinois State. The 5-6 Gutierrez, from Thornton, Colo., led her 2001 Western Nebraska Community College team to the NJCAA finals last year. She was an honorable mention all-stater at Thornton High School, where she was a four-year starter before graduating in 2000. Entering her senior season at East Richland High School in Olney, Ill., the 5-8 Stevenson had scored 1,674 points and has 495 career steals. A long-range shooting threat, Stevenson had 156 three-pointers during her sophomore and junior seasons.

Signs of Much Better Times

The Redbirds are 5-5 since an 0-7 start, and the statistics bear out that Jenny Yopp's team has improved dramatically in their last seven games since the end of a 6-games-in-12-days run into mid-December. The biggest turnarounds have come in the areas of defense and ballhandling (see box at right).

First, Most

Illinois State forced Southern Illinois into 24 turnovers and committed just 20 of its own, marking the first time this season the 'Birds had fewer turnovers than their foes. Also, the Redbirds scored a season-high 69 points against the Salukis (1/20). The Redbirds followed with 17 turnovers in a win over Wichita State, matching the Shocker total for the game.

Three Straight in the Valley

A win over Southwest Missouri State would be three in a row for the Redbirds for the first time since the 1997-98 team reeled-off four in a row after a league-opening loss.

Better Than Last Year

A year ago, the Redbirds won five times in 27 games (this year, 5 times in 12). Last year, ISU had 52 blocked shots for the season--they have 49 with at least 10 games left in 2001-02.

Larson on Target

The Redbirds have shot better in recent games, hitting 78-163 (.479) over their last three games. Kristi Larson has been the leader, sinking 30-52 (.576) in her last six games.

Chris K. Leads Key D.

Southern Illinois guard Holly Teague had 16 first-half points against ISU, but the 'Birds bounced back in the second half thanks to the stellar defense of freshman Chris Kutschinski, who helped hold Teague to one free throw after intermission in a Redbird comeback win.

The Best Defense ...

The Redbirds are limiting opponents to just 38.9 percent field goal shooting, the second-lowest rate in the 25 years for which Illinois State has full statistics. Opponents' 29.5 percent from three-point range is the lowest in Redbird history.

League Advantage: Illinois State

With a 190-138 all-time regular-season conference record (.579), the Redbirds have winning records against five of nine current league foes. (see box at right).

Stealin' Steph Rides Again

With Steph Reichle collecting four at Southern Illinois (1/20) and three more against Wichita State, Illinois State had its season-high with 11 steals in each of its last two games. It is the most by a Redbird team in 31 games (12 at Wichita State, Jan. 4, 2001).

Redbird Review (5-12, 3-5)

• Illinois State 69, Southern Illinois 67

Sunday, Jan. 20, 2002, SIU Arena, Carbondale, Ill. Freshman Chris Kutschinski came off the bench to spark a 20-3 run which resulted from defensive pressure which forced nine SIU turnovers in seven minutes as the 'Birds came back from 11 down in the final 10 minutes to break a 14-game losing streak away from Redbird Arena.

Illinois State 68, Wichita State 64

Thursday, Jan. 24, 2002, Redbird Arena, Normal, Ill. Taren O'Brien had to leave with a cut on her chin in the second half. She came back in time to lead her team to its second straight victory by scoring a career-high 19 points, including a Redbird Arena record-tying 11 free throws made. ISU out-rebounded the powerful Shockers 38-36 and held WSU to 35 percent from the field.

Harakas Steps Up

With Sharon Blade sidelined by a foot injury, freshman post player Michelle Harakas stepped up her performance on the Evansville-Southern Illinois road trip by averaging 7.5 points, 6.5 rebounds and 1.0 blocks. The consistent Harakas has played short stints in most games, but has scored in 15 of ISU's 16 contests, hitting 17 of her last 31 field goal attempts in the process.

Donovan Twice As Good

At the start of 2002, freshman Katie Donovan's field goal percentage stood at just .267. In six games since the calendar turned, she has poured in 18 of 33 shots for a .545 percentage--more than double her efficiency for the first 10 games.

More Charity (Tosses)

Through the first four weeks of league games, Illinois State ranked dead last in the Valley in getting to the free throw line. However, the 'Birds shot 64 of the 137 conference free throws in their last two games, wins over Southern Illinois and Wichita State. (see box above right).

The 'Rollover' Homestand

This year, Illinois State and Indiana State both play four straight home games at the end of the first round and the start of the second round of the Valley's double round-robin schedule. The 'Birds have played four or more straight league home games five times before: 4-0 in 1997, 2-2 in 1998, 2-3 in 1993, 4-0 in 1991 and 3-1 in 1986.

Larson For the Block

Senior Kristi Larson is one of only four players in Redbird history with 70 or more career blocked shots. Her 25 blocks this season are No. 8 by a Redbird player in a single season. (see box above right).

Blade Sidelined

Redbird post player Sharon Blade has a stress-related foot injury which will likely keep her on the sidelines until near the end of January, pending the results of a bone scan prior to the Evansville game. She joins sophomore Jaci McCormack and freshman Sophie Tirtiaux on the sidelines for the Redbirds. McCormack and Tirtiaux are both out for the season.

Defense Rules

The Redbird defense limited Creighton to just 22.9 percent field goal shooting (1/12) in a 64-57 overtime win. That was the fourth lowest mark by a Redbird team in 25 years for which Illinois State has complete statistics.
