About The Game: These two teams faced each other just 11 days ago in Normal. Illinois State is coming off of its first road victory of the season and has won five of its last eight, including two straight. Drake has won two of its last three, ending a six-game losing skid. Since the last meeting, the Redbirds have won two straight, while the Bulldogs have posted a win and a loss.

Series History: This is the 56th meeting between the two schools with Illinois State leading the series 37-18.

The Redbirds own a 12-11 advantage in Des Moines, including a 12-9 mark since joining The Valley.

Last Meeting: Vince Greene scored a team-high 14 points for Illinois State, but was the only player for the Redbirds to score in double figures as ISU fell to Drake 59-48 in Valley action Saturday at Redbird Arena. Illinois State shot just 37 percent from the field. Gregg Alexander finished with eight points and three assists. Casey Reid went 2-for-3, finishing with five points on the night. Drake stayed ahead of the 'Birds most of the game, shooting 51 percent from the field. Sophomore Lonnie Randolph finished with a game-high 23 points. J.J. Sola shot 6-of-10 from the field, recording 12 points for the Bulldogs.

THE COACHES

Tom Richardson (St. Xavier '77) is 54-61 in his fourth season at Illinois State. He is assisted by Chad Altadonna, Lance Irvin and Kirk Sarff. Richardson is 35-39 against Valley opponents, 19-22 vs. non-conference foes, 36-18 at home, 13-37 on the road and 5-6 on neutral floors.

Kurt Kanaskie (LaSalle '80) is in his seventh season at Drake. He owns a 59-132 record with the Bulldogs and has a 266-239 mark over his 18-year coaching career.

About the Drake Bulldogs

- Drake is located in Des Moines, Iowa, and enrolls 3,650 students. The Bulldogs are members of the Missouri Valley Conference.
- The Bulldogs have won two of their last three, including a 59-48 win over Illinois State at Redbird Arena that ended a six-game Drake losing skid.
- J.J. Sola leads the team in scoring with 14.3 points per game.
- In league games, Greg Danielson has led the team with 14.4 points and 9.9 boards per game. In the first meeting against the Redbirds, Danielson was held to one point and seven rebounds.
- Preseason All-Valley selection Luke McDonald's scoring average is down this season at 13.8 points per game, but he poured in a game-high 28 points at Evansville on Saturday.
- McDonald is shooting 33.9 percent on threes this season, after entering the year with a 44.1 clip.
- Lonnie Randolph led the Bulldogs in the first meeting against Illinois State with 23 points. He also chipped in 26 against Evansville. Randolph ranks fourth in scoring with 8.7 points per game.
- With a win tonight, Drake would sweep The Valley regular-season series against the 'Birds for the third time and the second in three years.
- 11 different players have started at some point this season.

Alexander the Great

Sophomore **Gregg Alexander** shined under the ESPN lights this past Saturday. After watching a 16-point lead fade to one against the Thundering Herd, Alexander took control of the game by scoring six of the Redbirds' final eight points to claim the win. The Lincoln, Ill., native matched his season-high with 21 points against Marshall while shooting 8-for-12 from the floor including 4-for-6 on treys.

Putting the Clamp Down

The biggest reason the Redbirds went 2-0 last week was defense. In the first 22 games of the season, Illinois State foes were shooting 49.1 percent from the field. In the wins over Evansville and Marshall, the Aces and Thundering Herd combined to shoot 39.4 percent from the floor – nearly 10 percentage points less.

A Recent Sampling

After starting 1-15, the Redbirds have won five of their last eight games. Ranking other members of the conference over the same time span, the 'Birds would find themselves in a tie for third with Wichita State and SMS trailing Creighton and Southern Illinois (7-1).

The Men of Troy

At Marshall on Saturday, the Redbirds played like the men of Troy, since Troy State was the only non-conference opponent to defeat the Thundering Herd on their home floor in the last seven years. Marshall entered the game winning 31 of its last 32 home non-conference games, but left with a 57-53 defeat.

Planes, Trains and Automobiles

Okay there weren't any trains, but getting to Marshall for the Bracket Buster Saturday game wasn't easy. Fog blanketed Central Illinois and forced the Redbirds to cancel their flight arrangements for Friday night. On Saturday morning, the fog was still a problem so the team drove an hour south to Springfield, Ill., and arrived in Huntington, W. Va., after a rocky 90-minute plane trip, two hours before tip-off.

This Casey is Still Swinging

Not wanting to go down on a called third strike, senior **Casey Reid** expressed to the coaching staff that he could still contribute for this team prior to the 'Birds' home game against Northern Iowa. Reid has been true to his word, in the last seven games he is averaging 7.1 points and 2.0 rebounds per game – as opposed to his 1.4 points and 0.7 boards per contest over the first 16 games. He is also doing it on the defensive end, holding both Evansville's Clint Cuffle and Marshall's Ronald Blackshear below their season average.

For the second time this season, Trey Guidry dealt Evansville a 20-point scoring performance. The Baton Rouge, La. native, trumped the Aces with 27 points at Evansville and clubbed them for 22 tallies Wednesday night.

Andy's Second-to-Last Strand

Senior Andy Strandmark's effort against Evansville would have made General Custer proud. In his second-to-last game at Redbird Arena, Strandmark posted his first career double-double.

Greene With Envy

Sophomore Vince Greene can get a little jealous when the opponents have the ball, but the Chicago native is doing something about it - he's stealing it. At Evansville, Greene tallied a career-best seven steals against the Purple Aces.

It's Easy Being Greene

Kermit the Frog might not agree, but recently sophomore point guard Vince Greene has made it look easy. At Bradley, Greene poured in a career-high 29 points on 10-for-13 shooting.

A Trio of Double-Doubles

For only the second time since Illinois State became a Division I program, the Redbirds have three two-year players averaging double-digit points. Vince Greene (11.9), Gregg Alexander (11.4) and Trey Guidry (11.3) became the second group of Redbird sophomores to accomplish the feat.

The Tao of Boo

For the explanation of Baboucarr Bojang's senior season, shot attempts seem to be the best philosophy. In the seven games where Bojang has had 10 or more attempts, Bojang has finished with double-digits in six of them.

108 Straight Games With a Trey on the Board ...

ISU enters today's game with at least one made 3-pointer in 108 straight games. In fact, in the Tom Richardson era the 'Birds have only gone one game without a made trey on an 82-43 loss at Creighton on Dec. 12, 1999.

Redbird Offense Struggles, Falls to Drake

NORMAL, Ill - Vince Greene scored a team-high 14 points for Illinois State, but was the only player for the Redbirds to score in double figures as ISU fell to Drake 59-48 in Valley action Saturday at Redbird Arena.

Illinois State (4-18, 3-11 MVC) shot just 37 percent from the field. Gregg Alexander finished with eight points and three assists. Casey Reid went 2-for-3, finishing with five points on the night.

Drake (8-16, 3-10 MVC) stayed ahead of the 'Birds most of the game, shooting 51 percent from the field. Sophomore Lonnie Randolph finished with a game-high 23 points. J.J. Sola shot 6-of-10 from the field, recording 12 points for the Bulldogs.

Early in the first half, Drake's Quantel Murphy set the pace for the Bulldogs scoring all of his nine points in the opening eight minutes. Randolph then took over for Drake, scoring 13 of the team's 31 first-half points.

Alexander and Greene both scored six points in the first half to lead the 'Birds. Freshman Kevin Troc snapped an 11-0 Drake run with his jumper with three minutes left in the first half. Reid recorded his first career three-point field goal, giving the Redbirds 18 points at the 10:30 mark. Drake led by nine points at half, 31-23.

Illinois State went on an 8-0 run with 16:19 to play in the second half, spurred by Alexander's drive to the basket. Randolph sank a jumper at the 11:45 mark to stretch the Drake lead, 40-35. A steal and layup by Greene sparked a short comeback by ISU, setting up a six-point run. However, Drake's lead was too much for the Redbirds, forcing Illinois State to foul at the two-minute mark. Consecutive free throws by Randolph and David Newman sealed the Drake win.

Alexander Reaches Century Mark

With four treys at Marshall, **Gregg Alexander** now has 110 three-point field goals for his career. It took the sophomore from Lincoln, Ill., only 51 games to reach the 100 plateau on treys. He ranks No. 10 on the Illinois State record books and needs two more to move into the No. 9 spot.

For Starters ...

Illinois State has gone two straight games with the same line-up, but it wasn't always like that. In the first 13 games, the 'Birds sent 11 different quintet combos on the floor for the opening tip. For the season, ISU has had 13 various line-ups this season.

Sending Out an S.O.S.

After being picked to finish fourth in the conference and sitting with a 5-18 overall record, the Redbirds are left feeling like they're stranded on a deserted island. However, for these castaways the cause, rather than the solution, can be found in an S.O.S. – Strength of Schedule. Illinois State's non-conference schedule ranked in the top 25 by both College RPI and the Saragin Rankings.

Not Shying Away From the Competition

The Redbirds' non-conference schedule strength is well-documented. ISU posted a 2-7 against non-league foes. Combined, Illinois State's non-Valley opponents, that they have already faced, currently own a 148-75 (.664) record, with only one having a losing record. Three schools are leading their respective conference races, while two are in second place and two are in third.

The Road To Aberration

Playing with a sub-500 winning percentage is a rarity at Illinois State, especially this late in the season. At 5-18, the Redbirds are headed to only their fourth losing season in the 33 years of basketball at the Division I level at Illinois State.

Greenbirds

Prior to this season, the 13 players currently on the Illinois State roster had combined for a total of 240 games played, or just 18.5 games per player, or roughly half of one season. Moreover, of the 13 now playing, 7 had never played in an ISU game prior to this season and 6 had never played in a college game.

FT Five-Peat ?

The Redbirds are in line to accomplish the feat of shooting 70 percent or better from the charity stripe for a fifth-straight season. This year, the 'Birds are sinking 72.2 percent of their free throws, which is tied for fifth all-time. ISU has not had a stretch of five-straight seasons since it bettered 70% from 1975-1979.

Caging a Tiger

On Jan. 15, the Redbirds added Missouri transfer **Najeeb Echols** to their roster. Echols, who will have to sit out a year to meet NCAA transfer rules, will be eligible for competition on Dec. 13, 2003. Echols played in 10 games for the Tigers this season, averaging 3.1 points and 2.8 rebounds per game. As a prep, Echols was ranked by most recruiting services among the nation's top 30 seniors.

No Thanks, I'm Just Watching

Neil Plank transferred to ISU from Wisconsin, but cannot play for the 'Birds until the 2003-04 season. NCAA rules require that he sit out one season. In 27 games, Plank scored 25 points in 173 minutes for UW.

The Addition of Size, Size and More Size

Illinois State added 241 inches and 670 pounds to the program next season with the inking of **Ronnie Carlwell** (6-10, 250, Maywood, Ill. • Proviso East), **Greg Dilligard** (6-8, 215, LaBelle, Mo. • Highland) and **Michael Sams** (6-7, 205, Mt. Zion, Ill. • Mt. Zion) on the first day of the early signing period.

Redbird Flashback

Since becoming an NCAA Division I program in 1970, the Redbirds have posted a 6-3 record when playing on February 26, with one of Illinois State's victory coming in 1977 and it is today's Redbird Flashback: **Feb. 26, 1977 • Normal, Ill.** – Jeff Wilkins scores 41 points in an 83-75 win over Butler. It was the last 40-point game by a Redbird for nearly 25 years, until Tarise Bryson scored 40 against Miami (Fla.) in Puerto Rico in 1999. Wilkins also added 14 rebounds and was 16-for-24 from the field. Billy Lewis added 10 as the only other 'Bird in double figures.

Following a timeout with 11:05 remaining in the game, the 'Birds went on a 13-0 run to extend their lead back to 23, which tied their largest lead of the night.

ISU Drops Second Exhibition to EA Sports

NORMAL, III. - Vince Greene led all scorers with 16 points, but Illinois State could not pick up the victory, dropping its second and final exhibition game of the season, 66-65, to the EA Sports All-Stars Thursday night at Redbird Arena.

Illinois State also got 15 points and 10 rebounds from Baboucarr Bojang, while Andy Strandmark, Gregg Alexander and Trey Guidry each contributed seven points. The 'Birds shot 54 percent from the field in the first half, but managed only 41 percent in the second half on 10-for-24 shooting.

Redbirds Fall 68-53 to Utah State

NORMAL, III. - Trey Guidry led Illinois State with 20 points, including six three-pointers, but it wasn't enough as the Utah State Aggies spoiled the Redbirds' season opener, 68-53, Saturday night at Redbird Arena.

Vince Greene was the only other Illinois State player to score in double figures with 10, while freshman Marcus Arnold turned in nine points. The 'Birds shot only 39 percent from the field and made only one of their eight (125) free-throw attempts.

Desmond Penigar led Utah State with 22 points, going 4-for-4 from three-point range. Point guard Mark Brown scored 19 points for the Aggies. Utah State shot 50 percent from the field in the game, including 50 percent from beyond the arc on 6-for-12 shooting.

Illinois State (0-1) got off to a slow start offensively, scoring only four points in the game's first nine minutes and dug itself into a 11-4 deficit. However, Guidry hit a three-pointer with 10:35 left in the first half that sparked a 13-5 Redbird run that gave Illinois State its only lead of the first half at 17-16. Guidry scored 11 of the 'Birds 13 points during the run, including three shots from beyond the arc.

Utah State (1-0) went on a 16-5 run over the final six minutes of the half, including holding the Redbirds scoreless for nearly three minutes, to take a 10-point lead into the locker room, 32-22. Brown ignited the Utah State run with nine points, including three lay-ups.

The Redbirds came out firing in the second half, scoring 15 of their first 17 second-half points from beyond the arc. Guidry helped lead the charge with three three-pointers, while Gregg Alexander contributed two. Illinois State used the offensive surge to shred the Aggies' halftime lead and close to within two points, 43-41, with just over 12 minutes remaining in the game.

Illinois State went into a scoring drought, however, over the game's next six minutes, which allowed the Aggies to build a 10-point lead at 51-41. Penigar led Utah State during the 8-0 run with seven points. Greene scored the Redbirds' next seven points, but Utah State was able to keep Illinois State from getting any closer than eight in the game's closing minutes.

Illinois State Falls to 0-4

NORMAL, Ill. – Trey Guidry had a career-high 26 points and Baboucar Bojang posted his first double-double of the season, but Illinois State could not get its first win falling to Chattanooga 75-68 in non-conference college hoops action tonight at Redbird Arena.

Bojang finished with a season-high 15 points and 10 rebounds, while Andy Strandmark tied his season-best mark with 11 points. Guidry shot 11-for-15 (.733), including 4-for-5 from beyond the arc. The Redbirds had only 10 turnovers and 28 rebounds in the game, their best marks of the young season.

Northern Iowa Edges the Redbirds, 66-64

CEDAR FALLS, Iowa - Marcus Arnold scored a career-high 19 points and Gregg Alexander chipped in 12 to pace Illinois State but it was not enough as the men's basketball team fell to 1-10 overall, 0-3 in the Missouri Valley Conference on Tuesday after a two-point loss to Northern Iowa, 66-64, in Cedar Falls, Iowa.

Leading by one point with 1:10 to play, the Redbirds let the game slip from their grasp as Ryan Paulsen of UNI hit a three pointer with :42 seconds remaining. NORMAL, Ill. – Trey Guidry scored all of his team-high 15 points in the second half but his final shot rimmed out with 3.4 seconds left on the clock to shatter Illinois State's hopes to end its seven-game losing streak as Wichita State beat the Redbirds, 69-66, in Missouri Valley Conference action Saturday.

Redbirds Down Sycamores, 60-52

NORMAL, III – Vince Greene scored eight of his team-high 14 points and Andy Strandmark grabbed a season-high 11 rebounds to lead Illinois State past Indiana State 60-52 in Redbird Arena.

The Redbirds, 4-16 overall, 3-9 in the Missouri Valley, had a 38-21 rebounding edge for the game and also got double-figure scoring from Chris Burras and Gregg Alexander with 10 each. Burras' points were a career high. After a 1-15 start, Illinois State has won three of its last four, including three in a row at home.

A crowd of 8,745 was the largest of the season in Redbird Arena and it saw the Birds shoot a season-high 54.8 percent from the field. Indiana State hit just 18 of 50 field goals, 36 percent.

The Sycamores, 5-17, 1-10 in the Valley dropped their 10th straight game, the longest Indiana State losing streak since 1989. Indiana State had just 12 turnovers to Illinois State's 22. David Moss led the Sycamores with 16 points.

Despite four turnovers in their first six possessions, the Sycamores led 7-5 after six minutes. But a Trey Guidry jumper tied it and Greene gave the Birds a lead and a cushion with a pull-up jumper and a three-pointer which put Illinois State up 12-7 at the 12-minute mark. Another Greene trey gave the Redbirds a 15-9 lead with 9:48 left before halftime.

The Sycamores scored six straight to tie the game at 15-15, but Burras went to work for the Birds at that point, scoring Illinois State's next eight points as the home team took a 23-18 lead into the final two minutes of the half. Illinois State led 25-20.

Two inside baskets by Baboucar Bojang and Alexander's three-pointer helped Illinois State open a 34-24 lead in the first four minutes of the second half. The Birds stayed in command through the middle of the second half on the strength of Strandmark's aggressive play around the basket. Strandmark scored five points and set up two more with a drop-down pass to Burras and the Redbirds led 44-32 with 8 minutes left.
