The Game Facts

- The longest series in Illinois State football history will resume against Eastern Illinois. The Redbirds lead the all-time series 44-37-9 and today will mark the 91st meeting in the storied rivalry.
- Today's game is part of the OVC-Gateway Challenge Series. Thus far, the Gateway Football Conference is 2-0 with Southern Illinois' wins over Southeast Missouri State and Murray State. This is one of five match-ups today with Indiana State at Murray State (6 p.m.), SMS at SEMO (6 p.m.), Tennessee-Martin at Western Illinois (6:05 p.m.) and Eastern Kentucky at Western Kentucky (7 p.m.).
- These two teams have met on the gridiron every season since 1945 except for two – 2001 and 1996. The game was scheduled in 2001, but was cancelled due to the September 11 terrorist attacks.
- This game features two of the top defensive players at the I-AA level. Illinois State's Boomer Grigsby, who led the nation in tackles a year ago and finished third in the 2002 Buck Buchanan voting, and Eastern Illinois's Nick Ricks, a ninth-place finisher for the 2002 Buchanan, are both on the 2003 Buchanan Watch List.

Denver Johnson is in his fourth season at Illinois State and owns a 17-19 (.472) overall record with the Redbirds. Prior to guiding the 'Birds, Johnson was the head coach at Murray State where he compiled a 21-12 mark. Johnson, 44, is a 1981 graduate of Tulsa and his six-year head coaching record stands at 38-31 (.551). He owns a 4-1 career record against Eastern Illinois.

► Eastern Illinois

Bob Spoo (Purdue '60) is in his 17th season at the helm of the Panther football program. Spoo owns a 102-82-1 (.554) mark at Eastern Illinois, his only collegiate head coaching postion. Spoo is 8-5-1 against Illinois State.

Scouting the Panthers

- Eastern Illinois is located in Charleston, Ill., and has an enrollment of 11,163. A member of the Ohio Valley Conference, Eastern Illinois was founded in 1895 and began competing in football in 1899.
- Head coach Bob Spoo is the winningest coach in the history of Panther football with 102 career victories.
- Eastern has advanced to the NCAA I-AA playoffs the last three seasons, but has been ousted in the first round all three seasons including the last two by Gateway teams with a 48-9 loss at Western Illinois in 2002 and a 49-43 defeat to Northern Iowa in 2001.
- The Panthers have finished the last three seasons ranked in the top 20. Under Spoo, EIU has ended the season ranked seven times.
- Eastern has won the OVC title the last two seasons, but was picked to finish third in the preseason OVC poll. Five players were named to the preseason all-conference team, including Nick Ricks, Nick Eller, Frank Castagnoli, Andre Raymond and Kory Lothe.
- Ricks is one of the 16 I-AA players tabbed for the 2003 Buck Buchanan Award Watch List. He finished ninth in the voting last season.
- Tailback Andre Raymond is also on a watch list for the Walter Payton Award, which is given to I-AA's top offensive player.
- Eastern ranks No. 25 nationally in team defense after allowing 285 yards per contest after the first two games. Pass defense is No. 30 nationally, while rushing defense is No. 43.
- The total offense is ranked No. 90, with the passing offense ranking No. 61.

Demetrus in Double Time

Demetrus Johnson made quick work of Truman State. He pounded out 132 yards on 15 carries and added three touchdowns, including a 49-yard scamper. He had the type of game that every running back would love to have at the end of the game, but he did it in the first half. Johnson didn't need to take a snap in the second half with the 42-0 halftime lead. His two quarter performance didn't go unnoticed as he was awarded the Gateway Football Conference Offensive Player of the Week honor.

Oliver's Twist

Cornerback Antwan Oliver started his collegiate career at Eastern Illinois. He played two seasons at EIU, before transferring to Illinois State prior to the 2002 season. The Ft. Lauderdale, Fla., native sat out last season to meet NCAA transfer rules, but has started the first three games with the Redbirds and leads the team with three pass break-ups.

Missed it By that Much

Truman State's touchdown run with five minutes left in the game spoiled the Redbird defense shutout bid. The 'Birds were on pace to record their first shutout since October 21, 2000, when Illinois State dropped Prairie View A&M 64-0. Against Truman, the Redbirds held the Bulldogs to 51 yards rushing and a 3-for-15 success rate on third down conversions.

Breaking Down the Conference Challenge Series

Today's match-up is part of the 2003 Gateway-OVC Challenge. By the end of the series, eight games will have been played between the two leagues with each league having four home games. Eleven of the 17 total combined members are involved in the series. Thus far, the Gateway owns a 2-0 mark in the challenge and also has the advantage in the all-time series at 67-40-1.

Harry Would Have Been Proud

Harry S. Truman said "carry the battle to them, don't let them bring it to you." Not only did the Illinois State offense execute that philosophy Saturday night, but it did it against Truman State, named after the 33rd President of the United States. The Redbirds scored on six of their seven first half possessions and never looked back. The six scores resulted into a 42-0 halftime advantage, the most points ever scored at Hancock Stadium in the first two quarters.

It's Just a Matter of Time

When Illinois State defeated No. 25 Southern Illinois last season, and then topped No. 17 Northern Iowa a week later, it marked the sixth-straight year in which the Redbirds have beaten at least one ranked foe. The 'Birds have won 10 of their last 21 tilts against ranked I-AA foes. Eastern Illinois enters today's game ranked No. 18 in the ESPN/USA Today poll and No. 19 in The Sports Network/CSN poll.

'R' Gang

Spanky isn't the ring leader of the Redbird rushing attack, but the running back arsenal put a spanking on Truman State. As the whole, the 'Birds totaled six rushing touchdowns against the Bulldog offense, by four different players. In all, Demetrus Johnson, Sha-Ron Edwards, Tristan Davis and Earl Newby all crossed the goal line. The six rushing TDs is the second-highest total in ISU history, last accomplished on September 11, 1999 against Southeast Missouri State.

We're Putting the Band Back Together

Today's game might as well be dubbed the Dillard High School alumni game since nine players in today's contest are Dillard alums. The Redbirds field three Dillard products in **Antwan Oliver**, **Joe Walkins** and **Sam Yeargin**. EIU has six in Nick Allison, Chad Cleveland, Vince Lewis, Fred Miller, Devon O'Neal and Alfred Osborne.

Illinois, the Sunshine State?

In addition to the Dillard High School alums, the Midwest rivalry between Illinois State and Eastern Illinois will have even more Florida flavor. Both of these programs have strong Florida recruiting ties and it shows on their rosters. The Redbirds field 18 players from the Sunshine State, while Eastern Illinois has 23.

The Boomer Watch

Linebacker **Boomer Grigsby** is at it again. Like last season, Grigsby has a knack for raising the bar for the big games. Over his career, most of his best performances have come against the toughest opponents. Such was the case again at Illinois. Grigsby wowed the Big Ten crowd with a game-high 21 tackles, including 14 solo stops. It was the eighth time the reigning GFC Defensive Player of the Year totaled 15 or more tackles in a single game. With performances like that it's no wonder why Grigsby was the nation's top tackler in 2002 with 179 stops, as well as the top returning vote-getter and the player to beat for the 2003 Buck Buchanan Award, which is given to the top I-AA defensive player.

The Redbird 500

It's not part of the Winston Cup circuit, but the Illinois State offense has been driving through the opposition. For the second straight game, the Redbirds amassed 500-plus yards of total offense, which was the first back-to-back effort like it since November of 2000. Against Truman State, the 'Birds totalled 522 yards bettering the 511 yard effort at Illinois. Nationally, the Redbird offense ranks No. 7, powered by an 11th ranked rushing offense.

A Heroic Homecoming...

For wide receiver **Dwayne Smith** his return to Memorial Stadium on the Illinois' campus was almost perfect. The only thing the 6-foot-3, senior didn't catch was an Illinois State victory. In a career game on the field where it all started, Smith hauled in a Redbird record 14 passes topping the six-year mark of Darnell Jones by one. Smith's 14 grabs covered 243 yards, just 16 yards shy of another school mark and the second best receiving total in school history. The Rantoul, Ill., native also caught a pair of touchdown passes, including a 74-yarder and earned the GFC Offensive Player of the Week for his efforts.

... And He Left His Mark

Desmond Howard, Chris Carter, Charles Rogers or Brandon Lloyd couldn't hold a candle to **Dwayne Smith**'s performance at Memorial Stadium against Illinois. That's because his 14 catches and 243 yards claimed the stadium record for catches and receiving yards, in the 79-year history of the facility.

Lambert's Return

Assistant coach **Ron Lambert** makes his second trip to Eastern Illinois after leaving the Panther staff to join **Denver Johnson** and the Redbirds in 2001. This season Lambert returns as the defensive coordinator for Illinois State to face many of the players he recruited for Eastern Illinois. Lambert was on Bob Spoo's staff from 1998-2000 and helped lead the Panthers to a NCAA I-AA Playoff appearance in 2000.

Souzy Playmaker

Against Illinois, quarterback **Mike Souza** showcased his ability to make plays. Souza passed for a career-high 385 yards against the Big Ten foe, a mark that ranks No. 4 in the ISU record book and was the second highest total by an Illinois' opponent at Memorial Stadium. He also legged 71 yards on the ground to lead the Redbird rushing attack. His 456 yards of total offense ranks No. 3 all-time at Illinois State.

A Schedule of Firsts

For the first time in the history of Illinois State football, the Redbirds will be playing a 12-game schedule. In addition, the 'Birds will host seven of the 12 contests at Hancock Stadium, which is the largest regular-season home slate in school history.

A Namesake Schedule

In addition to many firsts, the 2003 schedule is a perfect fit for Illinois State – since the Redbirds will only leave the state of Illinois twice all season. How fitting for a state university. The Redbirds won't leave the Land of Lincoln until October 25, when Illinois State travels to Youngstown State. Two weeks later, the Redbirds will face SMS in Springfield, Mo.

THE LAST TIME THEY MET

EIU Jumps on Redbirds Early

September 28, 2002

CHARLESTON, Ill. – Scoring on four of its first five possessions, Eastern Illinois took a quick 17-0 lead after the first quarter and continued to dominate offensively as the Redbirds managed just one field goal and one touchdown in the Panther's 45-10 win Saturday in front of 10,731 at O'Brien Field in Charleston.

Chip Taylor's grab at the EIU 15-yard line set up the only 'Bird TD of the game with 31 seconds remaining. Two plays later and with 18 seconds on the clock, Mike Souza connected on a 14-yard pass to Dwayne Smith for his second touchdown of the season. Stephen Carroll got the 'Birds the extra point.

Eastern Illinois improves to 2-2 on the year as the 'Birds take the same mark, 2-2. The 35-point margin of defeat tied the largest Panther win between the two schools in the series' history, dating back to 1978 when EIU beat ISU 42-7.

To start the second half, Zouzounis, who replaced starting QB Souza in the first quarter, was picked off by Chad Cleveland on the third play of the half, who returned it to the Illinois State three-yard line. The play set up EIU's fourth TD, a 3-yard scramble by Taylor, his second of the game. Kicker Steve Kuehn secured the extra point for the Panthers, who took a commanding 31-3 lead.

A forced fumble at ISU's 38-yard line by George Lowe on Jon Laurenti's catch with 11:18 to play in the third led to another Panther TD, a nine-yard plunge by Nick Eller as the drive went four plays for 47 yards and the Panthers increased their lead to 38-3. Taylor scored his third touchdown of the game with 1:51 left on the clock in the third. The drive was six plays for 71 yards and EIU went up 45-3.

Stephen Carroll's 24-yard kick with 3.2 seconds left in the first half got the Redbirds on the scoreboard after a fumble by EIU's Andre Raymond was recovered by Boomer Grigsby. It was a small consolation as the 'Birds trailed 24-0.

Another Would Be Grand

For the last three seasons, ISU has gotten 1,000-yard rushing campaigns from Quincy Washington (2002) and Willie Watts (2001 & 2000). The Redbirds have never had a 1,000-yard rusher for four straight seasons.

Transferable

Since 1993, when the NCAA rules changed to allow players immediate eligibility at the I-AA level, Illinois State has had 37 players transfer from I-A schools. Illinois State athletics director **Perk Weisenburger**, a Central Michigan alum, is entering his third year on the NCAA Division I-AA Football Committee. Among other things, the committee seeds the field and selects the eight at-large teams for the I-AA championship.

We Win ...

- Illinois State teams have won 112 conference championships -- an average of more than five per year -- since beginning Division I conference play in 1982 (from 1971-81, ISU was a Division I independent). Redbird teams compete in two different conferences.
- The football team plays in the Gateway, 17 sports compete in the Missouri Valley and the gymnastics team competes as an independent.
- Illinois State finished in the top four in 10 of 17 Missouri Valley Conference titles during 2001-02, including league titles by men's cross country, women's tennis and softball and a conference tournament champion ship by women's tennis.
- ISU has won 16 conference All-Sports Trophies since '82, including five of the last eight in the MVC.
- Illinois State has been in the Gateway Football Conference for 17 years and has won 20 games in the last five years while winning 22 over its first 13 years of membership.

...But Not At The Expense of Good Grades

Illinois State didn't forget the "student" in student-athlete while it was piling up all its outstanding performances during the 2002-03 school year. Redbird athletics had another student-athlete (Abby Scott, softball) named a Bone Scholar, the highest undergraduate academic honor at Illinois State. Scott became the eighth athlete to receive the honor in the last five years. In 2001, former linebacker Adam Waugh, who was named a National College Scholar-Athlete by The National Football Foundation and College Hall of Fame, became the third Redbird football player to receive the honor.

Redbirds Top Drake in Season Opener

NORMAL, III.—The Illinois State football team needed a wake-up call during its season-opener against Drake Thursday evening. It took an early score by the Bulldogs to get the Redbirds fired-up in the 90-degree heat at Hancock Stadium as Illinois State pulled away to a 27-13 victory.

Drake got on the board early in the contest when Jonathan Taylor (24 carries, 50 yards) jumped over a pile of Redbird and Bulldog players to score the game's first touchdown. The extra point was wide right, but the touchdown put the Bulldogs up 6-0. It was the only lead Drake enjoyed.

Illinois State responded when Sha-Ron Edwards (16 carries, 152 yards, 2 TDs) got the ball rolling on a pair of first down runs, setting up a 17-yard touchdown run up the left sideline by Demetrus Johnson (20 carries, 82 yards, 1 TD), his first as a Redbird. Quarterback Mike Souza (8-of-16, 45 yards, 1 INT) and Edwards ran the option to perfection on the Redbirds' next series, as Edwards scored from 15 yards out, making the score 14-6.

A 48-yard field goal by Stephen Carroll put the Redbirds up 17-6 at halftime.

The ISU defense rose to the challenge on Drake's opening possession of the third quarter. Linebacker Cavarri Dailey forced and recovered a fumble at the Drake 37-yard line, setting up a 31-yard touchdown run by Edwards, making the score 24-6. The touchdown run put Edwards over 100 yards rushing for the first time in his Redbird career.

The Redbird defense also held up well against the run, holding the Bulldogs to only 10 yards rushing on the game until late in the third quarter when Taylor broke free on a 41-yard run.

An 85-yard run touchdown by Edwards was nullified early in the fourth quarter when the Redbirds were called for a clipping penalty. But the Redbirds made a break moments later when Tyler Larick recovered a fumbled punt at the Drake 10-yard line. Carroll followed with a 22-yard field goal to put Illinois State ahead 27-6.

Drake quarterback Connor Jostes connected with Shea Moroni on a 5-yard touchdown pass late for the game's final score.

Redbirds Drop 49-22 Decision at Illinois

CHAMPAIGN, III.—Former Illinois receiver Dwayne Smith had a career game against his old team, breaking an Illinois State record with 14 receptions on the day, but the Illini took advantage of an early Redbird turnover, as Illinois came away with a 49-22 victory Saturday afternoon at Memorial Stadium.

Smith (14 catches, 243 yards, 2 touchdowns) broke the school record for receptions in a game, a mark previously held by Darnell Jones. Jones set the record against Western Illinois on November 8, 1997. Quarterback Mike Souza had a career day as well, setting new personal highs in completions (33), attempts (56) and yards (385).

Souza moved the ball with ease during the game's first series. He completed his first four passes, including a 30-yard rollout to Smith at the Illinois 30-yard line.

Ramon Barber and Smith were at the receiving end of Souza's next three completions, as the Redbirds advanced the ball to the Illinois 5 yard line. Souza fumbled four plays later however, and the Illini recovered the ball in the end zone.

After the teams traded possessions, Illinois got on the board with 7:23 left in the first quarter. Quarterback Jon Beutjer (16-of-23, 207 yards, 4 touchdowns) was pressured by Ryan Thorne, but rolled right and found a wide-open Mark Kornfeld for a 32 yard touchdown pass, putting the Illini on top 7-0.

Beutjer connected with Kelvin Hayden on the Illini's next series. His 41-yard touchdown reception put Illinois up 14-0.

Illinois continued to work the arm of Beutjer, this time on a 30-yard scoring strike to Lonnie Hurst, putting the Illini up by three touchdowns before the end of the first quarter.

The Illini started the second quarter with possession, but linebacker Andrew Papoccia intercepted a Beutjer pass intended for Ada Adeyemo at the Illinois State 30. The Redbirds then marched downfield on a 15 play, 63-yard drive, which resulted in a 27-yard field goal by Stephen Carroll.

NORMAL, III.—The Illinois State football team used a first half onslaught to overwhelm the visiting Truman State Bulldogs, eventually closing the campaign with a convincing 49-6 victory Saturday night in front of 7,339 at Hancock Stadium.

After the Redbirds deferred the opening kickoff to Truman State, Bulldog running back Jerard Leverson fumbled on the second play from scrimmage. Boomer Grigsby recovered the ball at the Truman State 22 yard line.

Five plays later, Demetrus Johnson scored his second touchdown of the season from 1 yard out, putting the Redbirds up 7-0 just three minutes into the game.

Later in the quarter the Redbirds got some excellent special teams play from Andrew Papoccia. Papoccia faked out two Truman State defenders and advanced the ball 29 yards on a punt return into Bulldog territory. A pair of Redbird penalties couldn't stop the momentum as quarterback Mike Souza rolled right and found freshman Laurént Robinson open in the end zone for his first career touchdown and a 14-0 lead.

The Redbirds caught a break on their next possession when it looked as if Johnson fumbled at mid-field. The referees awarded Truman State the ball, but reversed the call, saying Johnson's forward progress was down at the 50 yard line.

On the next play, Johnson scampered 49 yards along the right sideline for another Redbird touchdown and a 21-0 lead.

A Souza completion to Dwayne Smith and runs of 18 and 8 yards by Sha-Ron Edwards led to the Redbirds' fourth score of the game. Edwards fought his way up the middle before finding an opening to the end zone for his third touchdown of the season.

Illinois State continued their stellar play on special teams as Pete Holak blocked a Truman State punt and Sesamir Yearby recovered the ball at the Truman State 36-yard line.

The Bulldogs finally got on the board late in the fourth quarter when A.J. Eads took it in from 10 yards out. The extra point was blocked for the game's final score.


