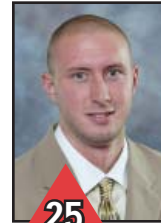

**About The Game:** Although the game isn't technically a BracketBusters presented by eBay contest (because its not televised), it is a match-up decided by the concept. Illinois State makes its first trip to Oxford, Ohio, looking to continue its winning ways after Tuesday's 58-56 overtime win over Drake. However, the 'Birds own an 0-10 mark on the road this season, while Miami (Ohio) carries an 8-2 home record and is riding a five-game winning streak.

**Series History:** Today's game is the fourth meeting in the series. Miami (Ohio) owns a 3-0 advantage in the series with a 65-55 win at Redbird Arena on Feb. 13, 1993; a 63-51 victory on Dec. 27, 1991 in the first round of the New Mexico Invitational and a 61-58 win on Dec. 29, 1988 in the consolation game of the Volunteer Classic.

## THE COACHES

Porter Moser (Creighton '90) owns an 90-81 (.5264) career mark in his third season at Illinois State, including a 36-47 (.434) record with the Redbirds. Prior to guiding the 'Birds, Moser served three seasons at Arkansas-Little Rock in his first head coaching position. Moser is assisted by Chris Jans, Daniyal Robinson and Brian Barone.

Charlie Coles (Miami '65) is in his 10<sup>th</sup> season at his alma mater. He owns a 171-123 (.582) record with the RedHawks and carries a 263-207 (.560) record in his 16 seasons as a head coach. He is assisted by Jermaine Henderson, Frankie Smith and Ryan Pedron.

## ABOUT THE MIAMI REDHAWKS

- Miami, located in Oxford, Ohio, was founded in 1809 and has an enrollment of 16,300.
- The RedHawks return nine letterwinners, including three starters, from a team that finished 19-11 overall and finished first in the Mid-American Conference East Division with a 12-6 mark.
- Miami advanced to the National Invitation Tournament, but was defeated in the first round at home by TCU, 60-58.
- The RedHawks lead the MAC in scoring defense by only allowing 59.7 points per game. They are also tops in the conference in defensive field goal percentage (40.6).
- Senior guard William Hatcher ranks No. 6 in the MAC with 14.6 points per game. Hatcher posted 21 points in Wednesday's win over Ohio, which was his fourth 20-point game of the season.

## BRACKET RACKET

Even though today's match-up isn't officially a part of *BracketBusters presented by eBay*, Illinois State and the Valley have left their marks on games set up by the event. Here's a breakdown:

- ISU is a perfect 3-0 in games decided by the BracketBuster format, including 2-0 on the road.
- The Redbirds also own a 3-0 record in the BracketBuster return games.
- The Missouri Valley Conference owns a 15-8 (.652) mark in games established from the BracketBuster concept.
- In non-league games this season, the Valley owns a 68-23 record (.747).

## FIRST THINGS FIRST

ISU enters today's game in search of its first road victory of the season. To date, the 'Birds are 0-10 on the road this season and have lost 12 straight away from home. ISU's last road victory occurred at UW-Green Bay on Feb. 19, 2005 in last season's *BracketBusters presented by eBay* match-up.

## BIG MAC ATTACK

Playing a league member of the Mid-American Conference is nothing new for Illinois State, especially since the 'Birds have faced at least one MAC team during the last eight seasons. Today's game is the 247<sup>th</sup> contest against a current affiliate of the MAC. The 'Birds have had their share of success against the MAC with a 146-100 record (.593), including a 64-47 win over Western Michigan earlier this season. The only current member of the 12-team conference that the Redbirds have never faced is Toledo.

## TAKING THE NORM OUT OF NORMAL

With an 8-15 record, the Redbirds are in the midst of an aberration. ISU will likely have only its sixth losing season in the 35 years of being a Division I program. Unfortunately, four of those losing campaigns will have occurred in the last seven seasons.

## DYER MAKER

Despite his 6-foot-11 frame, ISU's Levi Dyer continues to show his shooting range. In his last two outings, Dyer has posted his first back-to-back double-digit scoring games of his career, including a career-best 16 points against Bradley. During the last two games, Dyer is shooting 8-for-13 (.615) from beyond the arc.

## ESTABLISHING A FORTES

It has taken a little longer than expected, but junior Roberto Fortes is starting to showcase his forte -- being able to score. Despite tossing in 22 points in ISU's first 21 games of the season, Fortes has put together back-to-back-to-back career nights with seven points at Drake, 11 tallies versus Bradley and 22 points at home against Drake.



CARRYING THE VALLEY FLAG

In Porter Moser's tenure at Illinois State, the Redbirds have carried the Valley flag well in non-conference matchups. To date, ISU's three-year head coach boasts a 19-9 (.679) record in non-league games.

DILLIGARD JOINS THE CENTURY CLUB

When it is all said and done Greg Dilligard will go down in history as one of the best defensive players to suit up for ISU. In his third season, Dilligard now ranks No. 4 in career blocked shots with 113, becoming only the fifth player to post 100 or more career blocks as a Redbird. He also has 51 blocks for the year, which is second best.

SETTING A DEFENSIVE STANDARD

In addition to having their sights on the school record for points allowed per game, the Redbirds are also in pursuit of the school record for defensive field goal percentage. Currently, ISU foes are shooting 39.7 percent from the field, while the school mark is 40.2 percent, which was set during the 1996-97 season.

THE REDBIRD SHUFFLE

Through 24 games, the 'Birds have courted 10 different starting line-ups this season. The total more than doubles that of last season, in which the 'Birds had four different starting combinations. Of the 14 players on the roster, 11 have earned starting assignments and no combination has been used for more than seven games.

DILLY'S HOLDING ON

With his back-to-back double-digit scoring games, Greg Dilligard's season scoring average rests at 10.0 points per game. The scoring average, which ranks No. 1 on the team, and ISU has never had its leading scorer average less than double figures for a season since becoming a Division I program in 1970-71.

196 GAMES WITH A TREY ON THE BOARD

ISU enters the game at Miami (Ohio) with at least one made three in 196 straight games. The last time ISU didn't sink a trey was an 82-43 loss at Creighton on Dec. 12, 1999.

GONE IN 60 POINTS

It's not the sequel to Nicholas Cage's car thief film, but it has proven to be the recipe for success, or lack thereof, for the Redbirds this season. The formula is easy to follow. Opponents score less than 60 points, the Redbirds are 9-4. ISU foes score 60 or more, the 'Birds are 0-11. It's that simple.

D-FENCE, D-FENCE

This season ISU opponents are averaging 59.0 points per contest. If the Redbirds can maintain this effort, it would mark the first time that foes have been held below 66 points per game for three straight seasons since the 1985-86, 1984-85 and 1983-84 campaigns. Also, the 59.0 points allowed ranks as the lowest in school history.

MAKING THE GRADE

The Illinois State men's basketball team set a record GPA during the Fall 2005 semester by posting a collective 2.81 GPA, topping the old mark of 2.75. The athletic department as a whole also netted a new standard with a 2.93 GPA, while having a record 201 student-athletes named to the AFNI athletic honor roll.

OUT OF AFRICA...

And into Redbird Arena for four Redbirds this season. Freshmen Dinma Odiakosa and Eric Vianney are from the continent, with Odiakosa coming from Nigeria and Vianney being from Cameroon. In addition, senior Nedu Onyeuku and junior Roberto Fortes were each born in Africa before their families moved to the United States. Onyeuku was born in Nigeria, while Fortes was born in Angola.

PRIZED PUPIL PLANK

Neil Plank added another academic honor on Feb. 9, when he was named to the 2006 ESPN the Magazine All-America® University District V Academic team. It marked the third time that Plank had been named to the district team, he claimed second team academic all-America honors in 2005 as well as being named the 2005 Prairie Farms/Missouri Valley Conference Scholar-Athlete of the Year. He carried a 3.93 grade point average as an undergraduate finance major and is currently pursuing his master's in business administration.

THIS DATE IN REDBIRD HISTORY

Feb. 18, 1995 - Illinois State needed a pair of overtimes to knock off Southern Illinois 104-98 in Redbird Arena. Maurice Trotter paced five Redbirds in double figures with 22 points, while SIU's Chris Carr set the arena scoring standard with 38 points. Illinois State owns an 8-6 record on this date during the Division I era.

THE LAST TIME THEY MET

Miami Frustrates Redbirds

NORMAL, Ill. - Illinois State's basketball team stepped out of character yesterday and paid for it.

Miami of Ohio took advantage of some poor offensive decisions and defensive breakdowns by ISU to post a 65-55 nonconference victory before 8,260 people at Redbird Arena and an ESPN national television audience.

The Redskins, who won their fourth straight to boost their record to 14-5, used a smothering defense to harass ISU into 15 turnovers and a 41 percent shooting performance.

ISU enjoyed an early lead, but fell behind for good at 23-21 on a 3-point field goal by Landon Hackim with 4:14 remaining in the first half.

Miami extended the lead to 29-24 by halftime as it outscored ISU 11-3 over the final six minutes of the first half.

The Redskins stretched the lead to as many as 12 in the second half and were never threatened. ISU cut the deficit to seven with less than a minute to go, but it was too late.

Miami, which made its last field goal at the 3:20 mark of the second half, made 12 of 17 free throws in the final 2:17 as ISU was forced to foul in an attempt to get the ball back.
