Storylines

- Both teams enter today's game looking for their first Gateway Football Conference win. The Redbirds are riding a three-game losing streak, while Indiana State has lost nine-straight games, dating back to last season.
- With three-straight defeats, Illinois State finds itself out of the top-25 polls for the first time in 23-straight weeks. ISU is trying to avoid a four-game losing skid, its first since 2004-05.
- In the Denver Johnson era, ISU is 15-16 in the month of October.
- The Redbirds are looking to avoid their first 0-3 Gateway start since 2003.
- Today is Homecoming 2007. The Redbirds own a 42-39-6 record on homecoming, which dates back to 1916 and has occurred every season since 1921. ISU is 4-3 on homecoming under Johnson, but today's opponent is only the third non-ranked team the Redbirds have played on homecoming in the Johnson era.
- In addition to the homecoming festivities, Illinois State Athletics will be inducting its 34th class into the Illinois State Athletics Hall of Fame. In a ceremony Saturday morning, former student-athletes **Frank Purdy** (men's tennis, 1951-54), **Jackie Ryan-Beck** (women's golf, 1982-85) and **Galen Scott** (football, 1997-2000), will join the prestigious hall of fame, while long-time supporter and game-day volunteer **Jan Johnson**, will receive the Campbell "Stretch" Miller award.
- Linebacker **Kye Stewart** needs only seven more tackles to crack the top-10 for career stops at ISU.

The Coaches

➢ Illinois State

Denver Johnson is in his eighth season at Illinois State and owns a 43-43 (.500) overall record with the Redbirds. Prior to guiding the 'Birds, Johnson was the head coach at Murray State, where he compiled a 21-12 mark. Johnson, 48, is a 1981 graduate of Tulsa and his 11-year head coaching record stands at 64-55 (.538).

➢ Indiana State

Dennis Raetz became the interim head coach on Sept. 24, after Lou West was fired midway into his third season at Indiana State. Raetz last coached the Sycamores in 1997, and owns a 94-106-1 (.470) record at Indiana State, and according to the Sycamore athletics department will not be credited with the record during the interim. Since his return, the Sycamores are 0-2.

Weekly Media Luncheons

Each Tuesday during the season, Illinois State hosts a media luncheon in the team room of the Kaufman Football Building. The luncheon begins promptly at noon, with comments from two selected players representing both the offense and defense. Following the student-athletes, head coach Denver Johnson will address the media. Video from the press conference will be available on the Web at GoRedbirds.com before 5 p.m. Tuesday, while the audio file will be available immediately following the event on the ISU Athletics Media Relations ftp site (contact Todd Kober or John Sandberg for access information). If you would like to receive the quotes via e-mail, please contact the Illinois State Athletics Media Relations Office at gtkober@ilstu.edu prior to the press conference.

Requesting Credentials

Credentials (game and parking) can be obtained by contacting the Athletics Media Relations Office, Campus Box 7130, Normal, IL, 61790-7130. Requests must be received on official letterhead at least two days prior to the game. Passes that are not mailed will be available at the Will Call window (Gate 4) 90 minutes prior to kickoff.

Practice Procedures

Most practices are open to the media (approximately 3:30-6 p.m.), but only the first 15 minutes of Tuesday through Thursday practices are available to photographers. For all other media, it is recommended that an advance call be made to the media relations office to check on the status of practice for a particular day.

Interview Policies

- **Head Coach:** ISU's Denver Johnson will do general interviews following practice Tuesday-Thursday. All other requests for interviews must be submitted to the media relations office at least 24 hours prior to the scheduled interview.
- **Assistant Coaches:** Arrangements should be made through the media relations office. Most interviews will be conducted after practice Tuesday-Thursday.
- **Players:** All interviews with players will take place at the media luncheon or after practice Tuesday and Wednesday. Media should request players at least 24 hours in advance. Players who attend the Tuesday luncheon will not be available following practice that day.
- **Postgame:** The Illinois State locker room is closed at all times. Head coach Denver Johnson and requested players will be brought to the designated interview area. At home, the postgame media conference will take place in the team room of the Kaufman Football Building, located in the northeast corner of Hancock Stadium. The media should enter through the west doors and travel up the two flights of stairs to the conference area.

Scouting the Indiana State Sycamores

- Indiana State is located in Terre Haute, Ind., and has an enrollment of 10,568. The Sycamores are members of the Gateway Football Conference.
- After last week's 19-7 loss to Western Illinois, the Sycamores guaranteed their 11th-straight season with a losing record.
- Riding a nine-game losing streak, the Sycamores own a 1-33 record over their last 34 games.
- Indiana State's Chris Johansen leads the Gateway in punting with a 37.68 average, which ranks No. 73 nationally.
- Of the 116 teams in the Football Championship Subdivision (FCS), Indiana State's defense ranks No. 114 with 474.5 yards of total offense allowed per game.
- The Sycamores rank No. 115 nationally in rushing defense with 279.5 yards per game.
- Indiana State is also No. 109 in total offense with 255.33 yards per game, while averaging 11.83 points per game which ranks No. 107.

Sycamore Similarities

- Indiana State's Reilly Murphy (Torrey Pines HS) and Illinois State's Kyle Siskowic (Clairemont HS) both hail from San Diego, Calif.
- ISU's Nick Williams (Plantation) and INS's Chad Gregory (Heritage HS) are both natives of Plantation, Fla.
- Redbird offensive line coach Rod Carey and Indiana State running backs coach Jimmy Graves each played and graduated from Indiana. Brandon Joyce also played at Indiana two seasons before transferring to Illinois State.
- Illinois State's Jonathan St-Pierre (Quebec) and Indiana State's Bill McGrath (Saskatchewan) both are from Canada.
- Indiana State assistant media relations director Mike Williams earned both his bachelor's and master's degrees from Illinois State while working in the Redbirds' Athletics Media Relations Office.

Three Times Not a Charm

For the third-straight game, sophomore tailback **Geno Blow** ran for 100-plus yards. However, the Redbirds have lost all three games during that same span. With 100 yards against Indiana State, Blow would tie **Quincy Washington**, **Willie Watts** and **Toby Davis** for the third-longest streak of consecutive 100-yard rushing games in Redbird history.

Quarter Flash

The Illinois State offense was able to click during the second quarter at Missouri State, as the Redbirds scored 28 points in just seven minutes and 55 seconds. The offensive output equaled the school record for points in the second quarter, matching the 28 points scored in the second quarter of the Redbirds' 61-35 win at Southern Illinois, Oct. 23, 1999.

Bert for the Block

Sophomore **Bert Whigham** provided some excitement during the second quarter of last week's game at Missouri State, as the Lake Mary, Fla., native blocked a punt that later led to a Redbird score. Whigham became the first Redbird to block a punt since Nov. 13, 2004, at Northern Iowa, when **Alex Filin** stuffed the Panthers' punter.

Slugfest in Springfield

- The 58 points scored by Missouri State in last weekend's game was the most surrendered by ISU since Western Kentucky dropped the Redbirds, 58-14, Nov. 3, 2001.
- The 99 combined points between ISU and MSU were the sixth-most all-time in a Gateway game.
- Missouri State's 24 points equaled the most first-half points surrendered by ISU this season. The Redbirds also allowed 24 first-half tallies at Missouri.
- The Redbirds' 28 second-quarter points tied the school record for points in the second quarter, equaling the 28 tallies scored at Southern Illinois Oct. 23, 1999.
- Missouri State scored on its first three possessions. It was the first time all season that a Redbird opponent scored on the first two drives of the game. The Bears also scored touchdowns on their final six possessions of the game.
- MSU's 58 points also tied for the most given up by Illinois State since joining the Gateway in 1985.

Trying to get their Kicks

The Illinois State football team has seen three different players attempt and make PATs this season, which is the first time in ISU's modern history (1949-present) that three different Redbirds have made the extra point in a single season. Tyler Funk has converted 10-of-13, Steven Fetzer is 5-for-6 and Kevin Mazur has made all three of his tries.

Mordis Makes a Comeback

After suffering what appeared to be a career-ending injury during fall camp, senior **Dave Mordis** has persevered and appeared in his first game of the season at Missouri State. Though he did not record a stat, the 2007 All-Gateway Preseason First-Team selection logged time in an offensive series in the second half, as well as serving as an end blocker on the PAT team.

Blow Knows Touchdowns

Sophomore Geno Blow set a new career-high for rushing touchdowns scored in a game, as he found the end zone on three different occasions last weekend at Missouri State. Blow, who also finished with a game-high 155 yards, became the first ISU player to accomplish the feat since former Redbird Pierre Rembert scored three touchdowns against MSU Nov. 4, 2006.

Moving the Chain Gang

It can be a nerve-racking situation – facing third down with the possibility of stalling a drive, but the Illinois State football team has been able to move the chains with regularity when faced with the circumstances. The Redbirds are the best team in the country in third-down efficiency, converting 52.7 percent of the time.

Hanging by the Same Chains

The ISU offense isn't the only one having success on third downs, so are its opponents. ISU's defense is surrendering first downs 51.2 percent of the time on third down. In fact, the Redbirds rank No. 114 nationally in defense third-down efficiency among the 116 teams competing in the FCS.

Lost in Interception

It has been an unlikely trend for Luke Drone, but after throwing three interceptions in each of the last two games, the Illinois State quarterback has been picked off a total of 22 times in his last nine games. The stretch, which dates back to last season, includes only 11 touchdowns during that time span. These are atypical numbers for Drone, who in his first 28 games with the Redbirds, threw 39 touchdown passes with only 15 interceptions.

Horton Joins the Century Club

Wide receiver Jason Horton has assumed the role as the primary target of quarterback Luke Drone. Horton leads the Redbirds with 20 catches for 304 yards and two touchdowns, even after missing the Missouri game due to a sore calf. Against Missouri State, Horton joined a select group with the 100th catch of his career. He now ranks No. 8 in ISU history with 101 career grabs. Horton has also accrued 1,445 yards receiving, which ranks sixth all-time in ISU history.

Blow-ing Through the Defense

For the third-straight game, sophomore tailback Geno Blow had a stellar day running the football. The Seabrook, Texas, native has also showcased his speed, in addition to his power. Blow owns the two longest rushing touchdowns by the Redbirds this season: a 50-yard scamper against Northern Iowa, and a 30-yard run off a variation of the swinging gate at Missouri State.

Hronec Puts on the Clamps

After being on the sidelines due to an injury at Missouri, senior Bill Hronec returned to the ISU lineup the last two weekends – in a big way. Hronec collected a career-high tying 11 tackles in each game. He has also totaled two-and-a-half tackles for loss, eight solo stops, a forced fumble, a fumble recovery and his first-career interception over the last two games.

A Three-Headed Monster

So far this season, three different tailbacks have secured 100-plus yard games for the Redbirds, a feat that was last accomplished during the 2005 campaign. The Redbird runners have teamed together to give ISU a 100-yard back in all but one game this season. Rafael Rice rushed for a season-high 218 yards in the opener versus Drake, while Parrish Fisher ran for 122 yards against Murray State. Geno Blow became the third Redbird to run for 100 yards, when he collected a career-high 167 yards against Northern Iowa.

Wolfpack ... For Life!

While WWE wrestling fans might know that particular slogan, it is Illinois State's version of the group that has been knocking out opponents on the gridiron. Collectively, the Redbird H-backs and tight ends call themselves "The Wolfpack." The group has been on the hunt as of late, with 26 total receptions over the last four games. Fullback Garin Harcar ranks second on the team with 18 catches, while tight end Kedric Meredith is fourth with 13 grabs.

Rushing into the Record Books

Rafael Rice returned to the field at Missouri State after missing two games with a sore right knee. The senior running back is tied for sixth place in the school annals for career rushing touchdowns. Rice now has 17 career touchdowns and needs seven more scores to tie Ron Bell and Bruce Cullen (24) for fourth place all-time.

Another One Bites the Dust

With the 24-21 win at No. 14 Eastern Illinois, the Redbirds have now secured a victory over a nationally-ranked team in 10 of the last 11 seasons. ISU will have plenty of opportunities this season to notch additional wins over ranked teams, as four of its next five opponents are rated in a top-25 poll.

Tonight's Top-10 List, from the Home Office in Wahoo, Neb. ...

After today's game, Illinois State senior linebacker Kye Stewart should be part of a top-10 list - the top-10 tacklers in school history. Stewart only needs seven tackles to move into the No. 10 spot among the Redbird greats. With 321 career tackles, Stewart is one of 12 players in Redbird history to accumulate 300 or more tackles in their careers.

In Rare Company

Illinois State has proven that it can help student-athletes leap into the professional ranks, as the Redbirds have had a player selected in each of the last three NFL Drafts. Only one other school in the FCS Division, Cal Poly, has sent as many players to the NFL during that same time span. **Boomer Grigsby** (5th Round, Kansas City), **Brent Hawkins** (5th Round, Jacksonville) and **Laurént Robinson** (3rd Round, Atlanta) are the recent Redbird NFL Draft choices.

The Buck Stops Here

Illinois State linebacker Kye Stewart is one of 16 players chosen by *The Sports Network* to be on the watch list for the 2007 Buck Buchanan Award, which is presented annually to the nation's top defensive player in the NCAA Division I Football Championship Subdivision. With Stewart's candidacy for this year's award, it marks the sixth-straight season that Illinois State has had at least one player on the list. Other Redbirds to receive recognition include former all-American linebacker and current Kansas City Chiefs fullback **Boomer Grigsby**; former all-American defensive end and current Jacksonville Jaguar **Brent Hawkins**; and former all-American linebacker **Cameron Siskowic**.

All-America U

ISU has produced at least one all-American player in 21 of its last 24 seasons. Over the last seven seasons, 29 players from 12 different positions have been honored. Linebacker Kye Stewart was a consensus preseason all-America selection prior to the 2007 season.

Redbirds at Payton's Place

With the announcement of quarterback Luke Drone being named as one of 16 players to be considered on the watch list for the Walter Payton Award, it marks the third-consecutive season that an Illinois State player has been considered for that award. Drone, who was a first-team All-Gateway Football Conference selection in 2006, joins former ISU standout and current Atlanta Falcons' wide receiver **Laurént Robinson**, who received recognition in both 2005 and 2006. Former running back **Pierre Rembert** was named a finalist for the award last season, which recognizes the top football player in the NCAA Division I Football Championship Subdivision.

A Sixth Sense?

Since 2001, Illinois State has been the home of the Gateway Football Conference's Defensive Player of the Year award. **Boomer Grigsby**, the league's only three-time winner, won the award in 2002, 2003 and 2004; while **Brent Hawkins** followed suit in 2005; and **Cameron Siskowic** claimed the honor in 2006. Redbird senior linebacker **Kye Stewart**, the top returning tackler in the GFC, is off to a great start in 2007, leading the league with 72 tackles, which also ranks tied for No. 5 nationally in the FCS. So, it's only sensible that Stewart would be considered the favorite for the award this season, which would give the Redbirds six straight.

The I-Pass

The Redbird offense won't speed up the lines at toll booths, but it has been blowing through Gateway football stadiums with regularity the last three seasons. The Redbirds led the Gateway in 2006 with 227.8 passing yards per game, marking the third-straight season that ISU has led the conference in passing offense. If ISU owns the league's top passing offense again this season, it would become only the second team to lead the league in passing four-straight seasons, joining Northern Iowa, which did so from 1995-2000. If the string is going to continue, the pace will have to pick up soon for ISU. Currently, the Redbird offense ranks fourth in the conference with 182.67 passing yards per game.

The Three Degrees of St-Pierre

While junior Jonathan St-Pierre is in his second season with the Redbirds, he has already walked across the stage to receive one degree, a bachelor's in economics from Illinois State. St-Pierre is on pace to finish with three degrees by the time the Longueuil, Quebec, Canada, native leaves ISU in 2009. He will complete two courses at Miami (Fla.), where he began his college career, next summer to complete a bachelor's degree in business administration. This year, he has started the curriculum for his master's degree in economics and should have that completed in May 2009.

Denver Johnson - a Man of Honor

As ISU opened its 2007 training camp, head coach **Denver Johnson** earned recognition for his hard work as the Redbirds' mentor. Johnson was honored by the All-American Football Foundation, along with three other coaches, as a recipient of the prestigious Johnny Vaught Head Coach Award. Johnson led the Redbirds to their third trip to the NCAA Division I FCS playoffs in 2006, while also being a finalist for the Eddie Robinson Coach of the Year Award last season.

It's in His Sights

Quarterback Luke Drone has thrown for over 2,900 yards in each of the last two seasons. If he equals or surpasses that feat this year, Drone will become the most prolific passer in Illinois State history. Drone needs 1,255 yards through the air in ISU's final five games to knock former Redbird Kevin Glenn (8,251) from the top spot.

Good Chance for a Grand

Head coach Denver Johnson has had a 1,000-yard rusher in nine of the 10 seasons that he has been a head coach, both at Illinois State and Murray State. Last year was no exception, as **Pierre Rembert** rushed for a school-record 1,743 yards. Both **Geno Blow** and **Rafael Rice** are nearly halfway there this season. Blow leads the team with 490 yards rushing, while Rice has totaled 482.

The Full Nelson

That's exactly what the Redbirds are getting out of free safety **Tom Nelson**. Not only did he lead the Redbirds in interceptions in 2006, and currently leads the team this season, but Nelson is also Illinois State's primary kickoff and punt returner. The 2005 Gateway Freshman of the Year and 2007 All-Gateway Preseason Team selection has already posted six kickoff returns and a punt return over 20 yards in length, while averaging 21.6 yards per kick return. Nelson also recorded a career-high 13 tackles (six solo) versus Northern Iowa. At Missouri, Nelson intercepted a pair of Tiger passes, marking the second two-interception game of his career. The other occurred against another Big 12 foe, Kansas State, in 2006.

A Leader On-and-Off the Field

Linebacker Kye Stewart has shown his prowess on the football field, but it is also his ability to lead his peers off the gridiron that Illinois State football fans should stand up for and applaud. Stewart was selected from a pool of 1,300 top student-athletes from across the country to represent ISU at the 2007 NCAA Leadership Conference, LeaderSHAPE. A 2006 All-Gateway First-Team selection, Stewart was one of 356 student-athletes from around the country that attended the event held in Lake Buena Vista, Fla., from May 27-31. Stewart was the second-straight Redbird football student-athlete to attend the conference, as senior quarterback **Luke Drone** was selected in 2006.

Transferable

Since 1993, when the NCAA rules changed to allow players immediate eligibility at the FCS level, Illinois State has had 49 players transfer from Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) schools. ISU's FBS transfers on this year's roster include:

Adam Blankenship (DL, Nebraska); **Kelvin Chandler** (WR, Pittsburgh); **Parrish Fisher** (RB, Kansas State); **Brandon Joyce** (OL, Indiana); **Mitchell Moore** (RB, Iowa State); **Jonathan St-Pierre** (OL, Miami (Fla.)); and **Nick Williams** (DL, Pittsburgh).

Stewart's Doubling Over

Kye Stewart finished with nine tackles at Missouri State, which was the first time this season the Redbird senior didn't notch a double-digit tackle game. Stewart has 19 double-digit tackle games in his career and currently ranks tied for No. 5 nationally in tackles per game this season. He leads the Gateway with 72 tackles on the year.

Being Taken for a Long Drive

The ISU defense has surrendered 22 touchdowns this year and exactly half of those scores have come from drives of 70 yards or more. The long drives are sustained by Redbird opponents converting third-down plays. As mentioned earlier, Illinois State ranks No. 114 nationally defending third downs, allowing opposing offenses a 52.1-percent success rate on the potential drive-stopping down. The distance from the first down doesn't seem to matter either. When facing at least third-and-11, Redbird opponents have converted first downs 46.7 percent of the time against the defense.

Getting to the League

Not only have the Redbirds had a player drafted into the NFL in each of the last three years, but currently, there are four former Illinois State players in the NFL and two more in the Canadian Football League. Former Redbirds in the NFL include: **Aveion Cason** (RB, Detroit Lions); **Boomer Grigsby** (FB, Kansas City Chiefs); **Brent Hawkins** (DE, Jacksonville Jaguars); and **Laurént Robinson** (WR, Atlanta Falcons). In the CFL, former Redbird teammates **Kevin Glenn** (QB) and **Sam Young** (DB) are teammates again with the Winnipeg Blue Bombers.

The NFL is in Their Blood

Redshirt-freshman quarterback **Preston Earl** and senior offensive lineman **Brandon Joyce** are both the offspring of former NFL players. Earl's father, Robin, was a fullback with the Chicago Bears from 1977-82. Joyce's dad, Terry, punted for the St. Louis Cardinals during the 1976 and 1977 seasons. In addition, true-freshman quarterback **Drew Kiel**'s uncle, Blair, played in the NFL from 1984-91 with the Tampa Bay Buccaneers (1984), Indianapolis Colts (1986-87) and Green Bay Packers (1988, 1990-91).

Redbirds Secure Eighth Victory, Defeat Indiana State

TERRE HAUTE, Ind. – Behind a strong air attack that racked up four touchdowns through the air and a solid rushing offense, Illinois State downed Indiana State, 42-20, at Memorial Stadium.

Illinois State took an early 7-0 lead as Luke Drone and Laurent Robinson connected on a 90-yard touchdown pass with 7:05 left in the first quarter. The catch extended Robinson's school record to 32-consecutive games played with a reception and was the fourth-longest touchdown catch in school history.

However, Indiana State answered on its next drive with a touchdown pass of its own, a 40-yard connection from Relly Murphy to Carl Berman to tie the score at 7-7 with 3:38 left in the first quarter. The game was not tied long, though, as Drone threw his second touchdown pass of the day, this time to Pierre Jackson, to reclaim the lead at 14-7 late in the first quarter.

Indiana State cut the lead to one point, at 21-20, but the Redbirds rattled off 21-unanswered points to secure their eighth win of the season.

Just three minutes into the fourth quarter, the Redbirds answered with a 12-yard touchdown pass from Drone to Jackson, Drone's fourth touchdown pass of the game and his second to Jackson, widening the lead to 28-20. The 'Birds then widened the lead to two touchdowns once again on a Rafael Rice 18-yard touchdown run with 5:21 left in the game to make the score 35-20. Drone finished the scoring with a 4-yard touchdown run with 2:17 left to bring the score to its final at 42-20.

NORMAL, Ill. – A remarkable second-half effort propelled Drake past No. 7 Illinois State, 27-24, in the 2007 season opener at Hancock Stadium on Aug. 30. Drake scored all of its points in the second half and scored the winning touchdown off a tipped pass with less than 30 seconds remaining in the game to claim its first win at Hancock Stadium since 1982. The loss snapped ISU's five-game winning streak against Drake.

Senior tailback Rafael Rice had a career night against the Bulldogs in just the fourth start of his career. Rice rushed 27 times for 218 yards and two touchdowns, all career-high marks, but it was Drake's defense that turned the game around early in the third quarter.

The Bulldogs had interceptions on ISU's first two possessions of the second half and turned both takeaways into scores. Cornerback Poul Collins picked off Luke Drone's third pass of the opening drive and that set up a 36-yard field goal by Logan Rees to put the Bulldogs on the board. Drone's first pass of the next possession was intercepted by linebacker Cale Hunt and he returned it down the sideline 24 yards for a touchdown to tie the game, 10-10.

Drake's final drive started on its own 10-yard line with 1:23 left in the game. A penalty pushed the Bulldogs back to the 5-yard line, but Ingle completed three-straight passes to bring Drake near midfield. After an incompletion, Ingle threw a pass to the outside that was tipped by Tate and caught by Drake wide receiver Augustine Agyei, who streaked 56 yards down the sideline for the winning touchdown.

Redbirds Bounce Back with Win Over Murray State

NORMAL, Ill. – Special teams and rushing led No. 17 Illinois State past Murray State, 43-17, at Hancock Stadium. The Redbirds set a team stadium record in kickoff return yards and utilized the good field position with short, efficient scoring drives to avoid losing back-to-back home games for the first time since 2003.

ISU picked up 237 yards and scored four touchdowns on the ground. Senior running back Rafael Rice and sophomore running back Parish Fisher each eclipsed 100 yards with 106 and 103, respectively. They became the first Redbird duo to gain 100 yards in a game since Brian Thompson had 157 and Demetrus Johnson added 129 against Missouri State Oct. 9, 2004. Rice hit triple-digits in rushing for the second-consecutive game and scored two touchdowns.

Special teams played a big role in the Redbirds' success, as they racked up 205 kickoff return yards, surpassing the ISU Hancock Stadium record of 189 set against Tennessee-Chattanooga Nov. 17, 1979. Senior wide receiver Jason Horton and senior defensive back Tom Nelson each had career-long returns of 82 and 59 yards, respectively, snapping the career-bests they both had against Youngstown State in the 2006 FCS Playoffs. Redshirt freshman kicker Tyler Funk, who saw the first action of his career, kicked a field goal and was 4-for-6 on extra points.

The win was the Redbirds' sixth-straight over EIU.

COLUMBIA, Mo. — The Illinois State football team played hard for four quarters, but was unable to stop Missouri's offensive attack, as the Redbirds fell to the Tigers, 38-17, in front of 56,137 fans at Faurot Field in Columbia, Mo. The Tigers were able to dominate on the offensive side of the ball, as they racked up 581 yards of total offense, the most given up by ISU since 2005.

The Tigers were led by quarterback Chase Daniel's 294 yards of passing. Daniel was 21-for-34, and threw for three touchdowns and two interceptions. Mizzou also had it going on the ground, as senior tailback Tony Temple racked up 106 yards on 18 carries with a touchdown.

The Redbirds were led by sophomore receiver Eyad Salem, who had a career day with seven catches for 106 yards. Salem also scored his first-career touchdown on a 13-yard reception late in the fourth quarter. Senior Kye Stewart had a game-high 15 tackles, while Junior Tom Nelson grabbed two interceptions, giving him six for his career.

After Missouri returned the opening kickoff to the 43-yardline, Illinois State was unable to set up on defense and the Birds were forced to take their first timeout. The Tigers then struck on their first play from scrimmage, as Daniel hit wide receiver Will Franklin on a slant route and Franklin took it the distance for a 57-yard touchdown with 14:43 remaining in the first quarter.

Facing a third-down situation deep in Redbird territory, Mizzou struck again at the 6:03 mark in the first quarter. Daniel hit Temple on an 11-yard touchdown catch to capitalize a 10 play, 53-yard scoring drive. The Tigers were able to control the line of scrimmage throughout the drive, clearing holes for Temple to navigate through the Redbird defense.

Redbirds Taken Down by Panthers, 23-13

NORMAL, Ill. – With the score tied at 13-13 and just 5:24 left in the game, Northern Iowa's Eric Sanders connected with wide receiver Terrell Allen on a five-yard touchdown pass into the end zone that secured the Panthers' 23-13 win over Illinois State in the Gateway Football Conference opener for both teams Saturday afternoon at Hancock Stadium. A crowd of 10,473 saw

the Redbirds (2-3, 0-1 GFC) battle throughout the game against the Gateway's top defense, but in the end, it was the passing game of UNI that made the difference, as the Panthers (5-0, 1-0 GFC) moved to 5-0 on the season for the first time since 1992.

Tailback Geno Blow recorded his second-straight 100-yard rushing game, as the sophomore from Seabrook, Texas, led the Birds with 167 yards on 31 carries. Blow's total rushing yardage also set a career-best, beating his previous mark of 116 set last Saturday (Sept. 22) against Missouri. With a team-best tying 13 tackles in the game, linebacker Kye Stewart became the 12th player in Illinois State football history to record 300 or more tackles in a career. Defensive back Tom Nelson set a career-high in tackles with 13, while linebacker Bill Hronec tied his career-best tackles mark of 11.

While the defense of both teams dominated early in the first quarter, Blow gave the Redbirds an early 7-0 lead when he took a handoff from quarterback Luke Drone 50 yards into the end zone to conclude a four-play, 61-yard ISU drive that took 1:57 off the clock. Blow's 50-yard touchdown run was the longest of his career, beating his previous best of 39 yards set against Missouri State Nov. 4, 2006.

Northern Iowa took its first lead of the game with 47 seconds left in the first half when Sanders found wide receiver Victor Williams in the end zone for a six-yard touchdown pass, concluding an 11-play, 70-yard Panther scoring drive that took 4:21 off the clock. Kicker Billy Hallgren's PAT found its way through the uprights, giving Northern Iowa a 13-7 lead at halftime. UNI scored two field goals earlier in the quarter, with both coming off ISU miscues, as Drone threw an interception and running back Cortes Rice fumbled a pitch from Drone.

Blow eclipsed the 100-yard rushing mark for the third-straight game and led all rushers with 155 yards on the ground, but the Redbirds turned the ball over three times in the defeat.

On ISU's ensuing possession, Drone found his rhythm and connected on three-consecutive attempts, including a 14-yard strike to senior receiver Jason Horton, who managed to keep a foot in-bounds as he caught the 100th ball of his Illinois State career. The Redbirds were able to respond, 34-31, as Drone dived into the end zone.

Missouri State scored again, when Davis scored his second touchdown of the game, this time on a 17-yard run. Stokes made the extra point to give MSU a four-point advantage, 38-34, at the 2:20 mark in the third. The Bears were able to regain possession, when safety Derek Miller tipped Drone's pass intended for Horton on third down, and linebacker Jeron Poole made the grab to give Missouri State the ball at the 12-yard line. Jeron then found tight end Clay Harbor on a 10-yard touchdown grab to close out the quarter and give MSU a 45-34 lead.
