Report Summary

Social distancing and wearing a mask are critical practices that are essential to help prevent COVID-19 from spreading. Lincoln Police responded to 749 incidents for the month and 82 case reports were written for the month. Officers responded to 20 vehicle crashes. Patrol officers wrote 53 citations and 26 warnings for the month.

Of the 48 arrests for the month, officers arrested several for warrants, driving while license suspended/revoked, domestic battery, and driving under the influence. Detectives continued investigations on 18 cases including participating in CIEG task force operations.

The K9 unit had 2 deployments for the month of November. K9 ACE indicated to drug paraphernalia which resulted in an arrest.

DARE was able to help with Holiday Hearts for Kids this holiday season.

SRO officers have more responsibilities due to COVID-19 for this school year.

There were 20 crashes the Lincoln Police Department responded to for the month of November.






Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR)

UCR Report for November 2020










