# Monthly Report

August 2020

## Report Summary

Social distancing and wearing a mask are critical practices that are essential to help prevent COVID-19 from spreading. The best way to practice social distancing is to avoid public places and to maintain a distance of at least six feet between you and others. In addition, practice frequent handwashing and cleaning of commonly-touched surfaces. If you are sick or have symptoms such as cough, fever and shortness of breath, call your medical provider. Lincoln Police responded to 971 incidents for the month and 98 case reports were written for the month. Officers responded to 26 vehicle crashes. Patrol officers wrote 54 citations and 24 warnings for the month, along with 2 City Ordinance Citation and 1 City Cannabis Ordinance Citation.

Of the 46 arrests for the month, officers arrested several for warrants, domestic battery, criminal damage to property, and driving under the influence. Detectives continued investigations on 15 cases including participating in CIEG task force operations.

The K9 unit had 2 deployments for the month of August. K9 ACE had 1 indication. The items seized were drugs and drug paraphernalia.

DARE was able to host the 25<sup>th</sup> Annual DARE Golf Outing on August 21<sup>st</sup>. It was different this year due to social distancing. There were only 13 Teams this year, but it was a successful event. DARE would like to THANK everyone who participated in and/or sponsored the event. This is the big fundraiser for DARE each year.

There were 26 crashes the Lincoln Police Department responded to for the month of August.

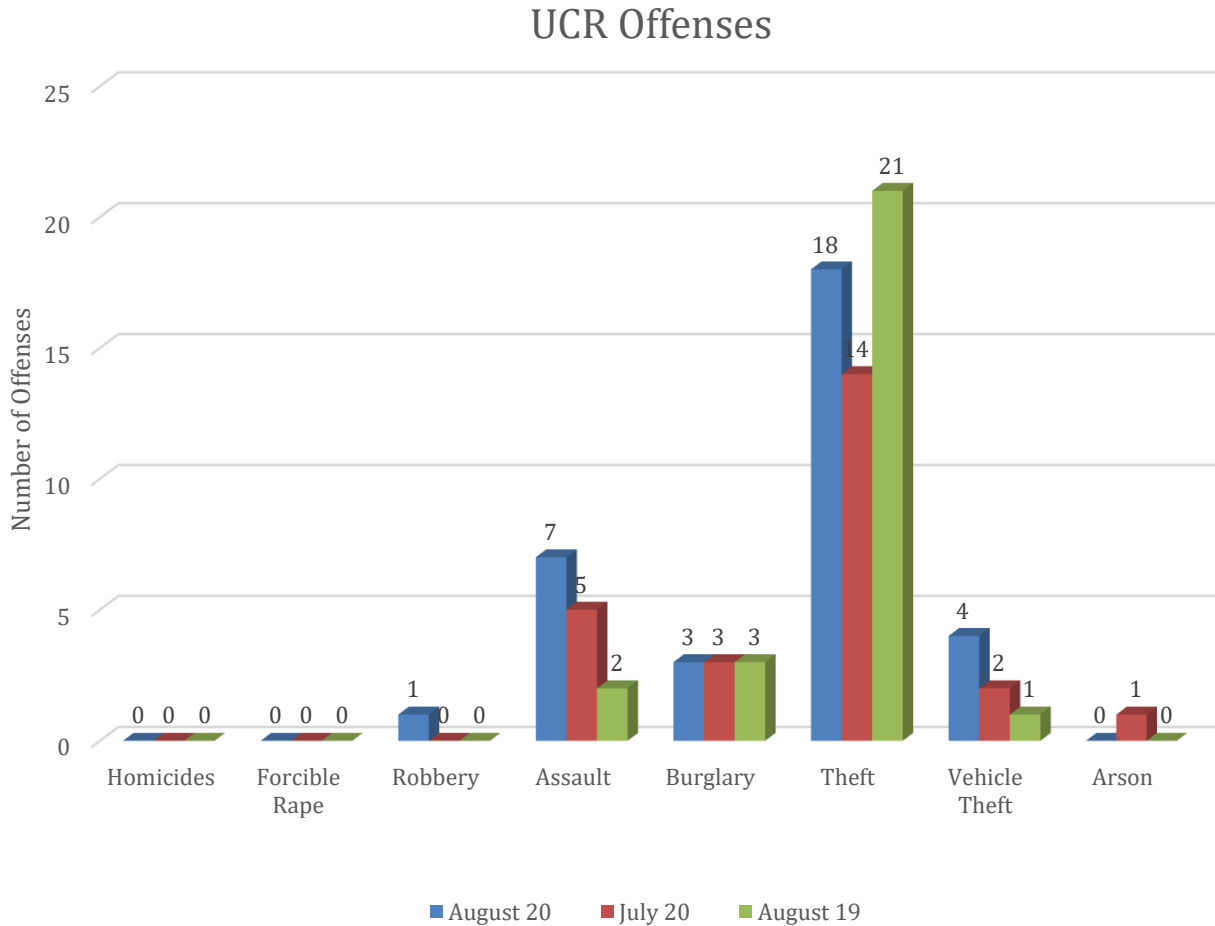

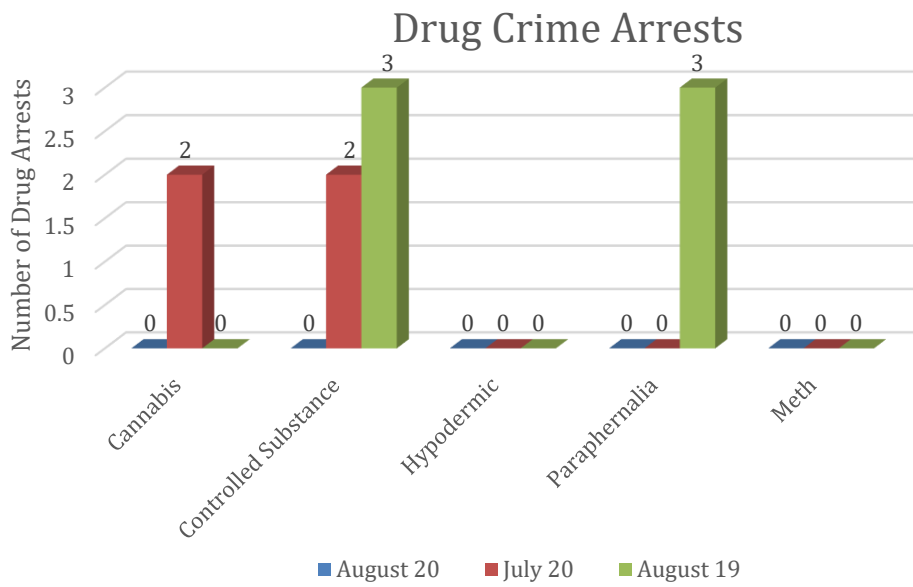
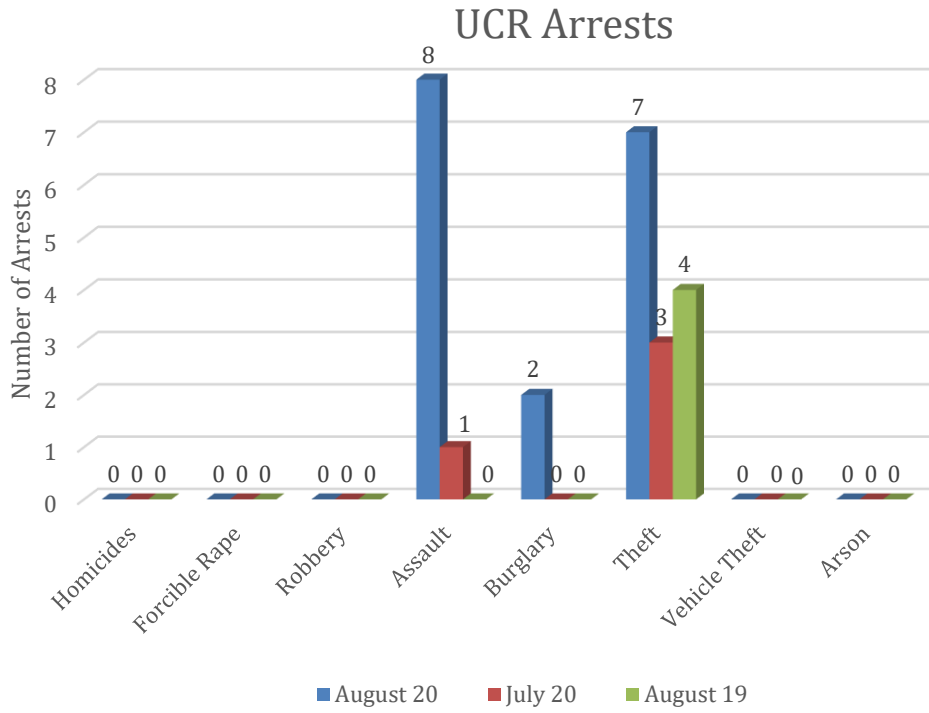
# MONTHLY STATISTICS

### UCR Report for August 2020





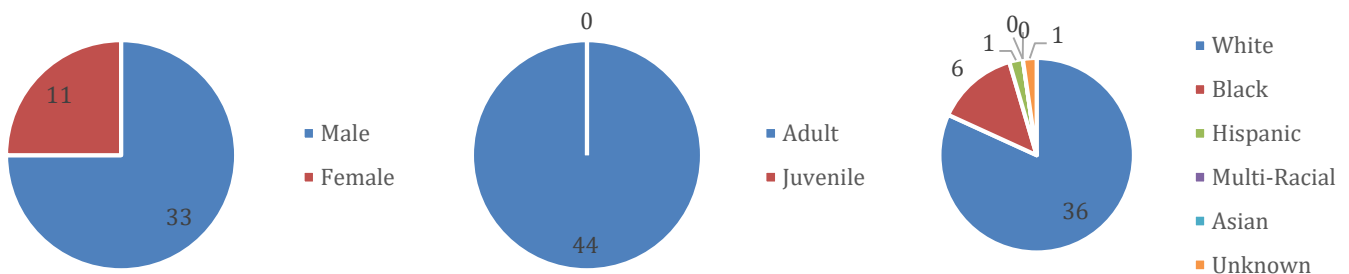
Lincoln Police responded to 919 incidents for the month of August and 99 case reports were written for the month.

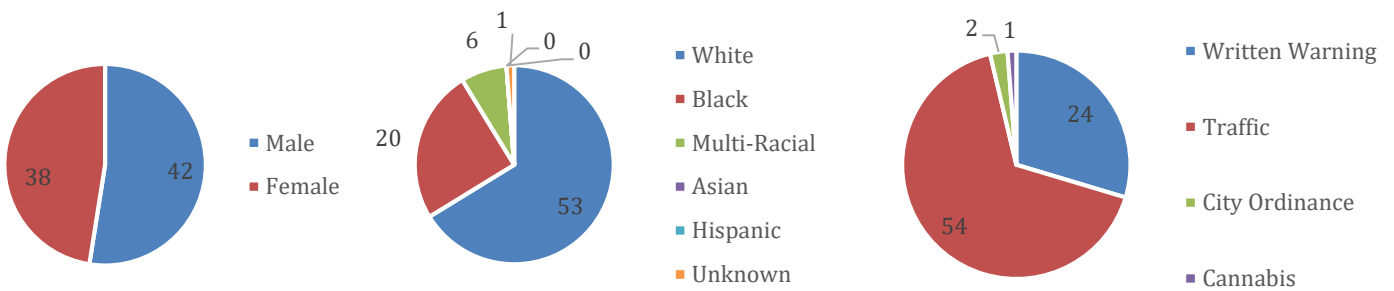
