

FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Friends,

I know that some of us are like the "Elf" Character, eager and waiting all year for not just Christmas, but everything about Christmas! The tinsel, the carols, the bows, even the chill in the air. And some of us are more like Ebenezer, critical of anything that is red and green, smacks of commercialism, and are happy to claim, "it's just another day". And most of us are somewhere in between. Once I heard a quote and don't know who said it, but it holds so much truth: "When you're young, Christmas comes once every four years and when you're old, Christmas comes four times each year." If you put me on a scale, I would normally fall all the way to the Elf side, for sure...most years. But not every year. This is one of those years. I've had these years before when I just can't get excited about it. But having said that, I've learned some, shall I say, "tricks of the trade" that I want to share with you.

First, you've all heard the expression, "Fake it til you make it"? This expression has been helpful to me in so many arenas of my life. Some may balk immediately and say, "Are you not being real with everyone then? Are you not being your authentic self?" And I say yes and no. When I'm not feeling "in the spirit", I find that when I'm around a group of people, like my church family, people around me lift my spirits, so suddenly, I'm all "Elfy" again. and the message to lift your heart to a new place. I know that some of you have a hard time attending services, so for you, I invite you to come during the week and just sit and pray in our sanctuary. If you tell me when you are coming, I'll turn on the lights for you. Pray. And just be.

Third, this year, just look for the "Christmas moments". Don't worry if every second of every day isn't filled with candy canes and Santa Clauses. Let me give you an example. Those of you who shop at CVS and have one of their cards know that we often get a long receipt filled with coupons and occasionally, there is one to five dollars off anywhere in the store. The other day, I went in and there was a little toddler running around who waved at me with the cutest smile. I had one of those coupons for \$5.00 off. The Spirit tapped me on the shoulder and said, "Give it to the mother of this little girl". So I did and she was so grateful for \$5.00 that tears came to her eyes. An ordinary trip to CVS for me became a wonderful trip to CVS for me and someone else. Look for those moments! Create those moments! Look outside yourself to create Christmas for others! A very Merry and Meaningful Christmas is my prayer for all of us!

President Goetsch called the meeting to order at 7:05 p.m. on Monday, November 15, 2021.

CONSENT AGENDA APPROVAL

President Goetsch inquired if there were any items up for removal or discussion as it related to the Consent Agenda items. Jan Hahn indicated CPR as referenced in the committee reports should be removed. All were in agreement and it was moved and seconded to approve the agenda as amended. All voting aye, the motion passed.

PASTORS REPORT

Pastor Laurie indicated things were progressing as usual. There was a baptism held on Sunday, November 14, 2021 for Reagan Grace Ingram. Confirmation for Dean Meinershagen started on November 15, 2021 with the first meeting being held with Dean at Culver's. Pastor Laurie reminded Council that she would be off from November 24, 2021 to December 1, 2021. ST. JOHN 160th ANNIVERSARY

By: Tonita Reifsteck Recap #3 Highlights Deaconess Hospital (1898-1974)



The Rev. Hermann Schmidt, pastor, was concerned about health care during the typhoid epidemic in 1898. With his wife, Adelheid being a Deaconess before their marriage, and with his congregation's support, brought deaconesses from St. Louis Deaconess order to Lincoln to provide trained nursing services to those who could not get care from the overwhelmed St. Clara's Hospital. In April 1899, 48 members of St. John Evangelical Church met and discussed building a Protestant Hospital in Lincoln. Already there was a Deaconess order now in Lincoln as they cared for those with typhoid and the elderly.

A 'prominent Lincoln citizen' and member of the church whose child had 'an incurable disease, made a vow to God to erect a Protestant hospital in Lincoln if his child could be relieved from is suffering. An estimated \$22,000. was needed to build and provide the furnishing and equipment. The site on corner of Seventh and Walnut was purchased for \$2500 and the cornerstone laid on Sunday, November 4, 1900. The cornerstone was moved several times as the Deaconess hospital changes evolved but now sits at the entryway off parking area of the church.

On January 19, 1902, the hospital was dedicated and occupancy was immediate. Deaconess from St. Louis were sent to fill the need. Several of the women of St. John were trained in the deaconess order (at present full list is not completed) tmr Because there was no money for food two women

from St. John Church – Mrs. Adam Denger and Mrs. Gustave Briegel went to the homes of members every day from morning until night in Mrs. Denger's "runabout" (a one-horse road cart) to both city and rural members of St. John for donations of produce and food. Members gave garden throughout the year, and food was canned by the parishioners to store in a basement room for the winter. A yearly event in the fall was the cooking of peach butter in a large kettle over an open fire for the years supply to the hospital.



In September 1902 Reverend Gustav Niebuhr assumed the role of Pastor of the church, and as Administrator of the hospital/ (this dual role was continued throughout the pastorates of Hermann Schmidt, F. W. Schnathorst, Gustav Niebuhr, Charles Hoffman, G. S. Gerhold, John Hoefer and part of the pastorate of Harold Barth. In 1947 the Illinois Department of Public Health determined that our Deaconess Hospital was 'in desperate need of additional facilities and recommended a new hospital be built rather than add to the existing. Because of the Hill Burton act the building of a new hospital was put in place. In May of 1951 St. John E & R church's officers of the Evangelical Deaconess Society were authorized to transfer all real estate to the Abraham Lincoln Memorial Hospital Corporation church. In May 1962 St. Clara's Catholic Hospital closed their building. On April 2, 1954, the new ALMH hospital was dedicated and Emil O. Stahlhut became the first hospital administer that was not also the pastor of the E & R church. The old Deaconess Home and Hospital became a 69-bed Nursing Home until 1960 when it became a 'safe care Home for women'. It closed in 1974 and those residents were moved to

"Extended Care wing" of ALMH. Rev. Niebuhr's aunt, Sister Adele Hosto resided in both facilities until her death in 1975. She was a constant presence in the health care throughout her years in Lincoln.

Members of St. John UCC continue to support its successor by being on the board of directors, volunteer at the hospital and other support programs to keep a vital health care facility in the community for over 121 years.








Stewardship Sunday was held on Sunday,




