Background:

The old system is extremely outdated and as we are unable to get adequate replacement equipment. The newer wireless technology would provide more reliable coverage, allow better in truck communications while en route to emergency calls, reduce the possibility of "loss of hearing" claims, and promote a safer work environment. The total cost of the project is \$20,824.91 and would be paid for out of the Fire Equipment Bond Expenditure Line 43-0800-8863.

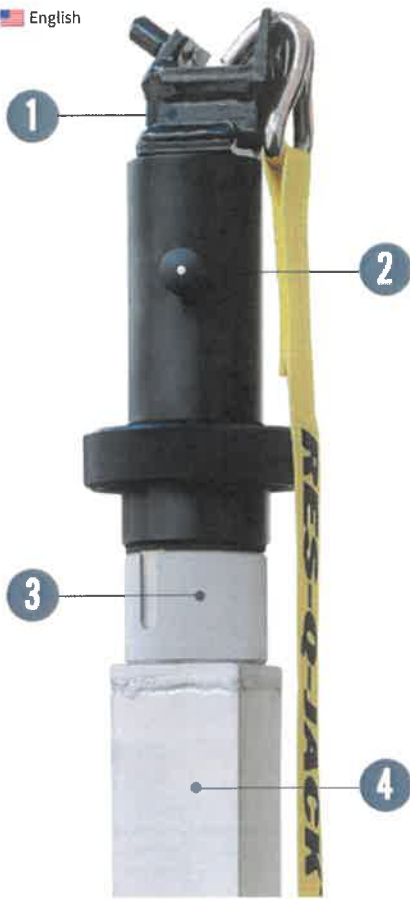
